## Class 3 Curriculum Newsletter Summer Term 2025



Welcome back to school. I hope you all had a lovely Easter



Our topic this term is *Justice, Crime and Punishment.* In this History topic, children will learn about the Justice system in the UK during different time periods. They will use and evaluate a range of sources to gain knowledge about the past.



Our topic this term Coastal Environments. We will be learning about physical and human geography. Children will learn about the Coastal Environments in the UK, and compare them to the areas where they live. They will learn about coastal erosion and how coastlines change over time.



Our Science this term will focus Rocks, evolution and inheritance. Children will develop their scientific enquiry skills as well as building upon their scientific knowledge and understanding. Science will be taught by Mrs McKelvey on Tuesday mornings.



We begin the half term reading the Town by the sea, and will later be looking at Poetry Sonnets. The children will be writing for a range of purposes including writing a short story dialogue, Poetry Sonnets and writing their own playscript.

English

DT will focus on creating a bag out of fabrics. Meanwhile in Art we will be focusing on creating set design for our play.



Our P.E days for KS2 will be on a Monday and Wednesday.

On Wednesday the children will be learning athletics, so will need suitable footwear.

Monday's P.E lesson will be taught by Sporting Influence with a focus of Cricket.



In Maths both years will be looking at Shape, with Year 6 then focusing on working towards their SATS. Year 5 will then move onto Statistics and negative numbers.
