It was a big week last week for our Year 6s who had their SATS. We are all so proud of how well each and every one of them tackled the challenge. They worked really hard and did their absolute best and whatever their results, we know they have done themselves and our school proud. It was an honour to recognise their achievements by giving them all a ribbon award in celebration assembly. Miss Ungerechts was also delighted that nobody got jam or honey on their test papers from the toast I made for their breakfast! Special mention must also go to the Year 5 children who spent most of the mornings in our ‘goldfish bowl’ spare classroom working with Mrs McKelvey. They were so understanding and supportive of their change in routine and produced some excellent work. Class 1 had their first Forest School session last Monday and thoroughly enjoyed peeling sticks, hammering and playing outside. This week we look forward to welcoming our local PCSO into school to speak to our KS2 children about online safety.

## What have we been learning this week?

### EYFS

This week in Early Years we have been reading the book "I will not ever never eat a tomato" by Lauren Child. We have investigated tomatoes, independently using a knife to slice the tomatoes and then labelling the skin, flesh and seeds.

In maths, Reception children have continued their work on shape, exploring whether we could make shapes out of other shapes. Nursery have been consolidating the maths work we have covered this half term.

### Class 1

This week in Class 1 we have been writing stories. We have written our own story to follow on from The Storm Whale. All of the children have really enjoyed planning, writing, editing and marking their own stories and we have seen some fabulous writing from everyone. We have all worked really hard to complete our five rainbow challenges in five days and I am pleased to say that nearly everyone achieved this. We will have a new set of challenges next week. Are you all up to the challenge?

### Class 2

This week in class 2 we have completed reading our class text of The Abominables. We completed book reviews and have planned a newspaper report based on the story which we will write next week. In maths, year 4 have been looking at angles and lines of symmetry while year 3 have been looking at duration. In PE we put all our skills together from this half term to play games of cricket and in History we wrote poetry based on the Viking invasion of Lindisfarne

### Class 3

Class 3 have been busy this week with their SATs exams in Y6 and learning about shape and internal angles of shapes in Y5. The children have worked incredibly hard on their spelling, grammar and punctuation revisiting how to use apostrophes for contractions and possession, how colons and semi-colons have been used. They have continued to read their book "Who Let the Gods Out?" linking to our history (Ancient Greeks). We have finished our art projects looking at light and colour. In history they have completed a session in the style of Antiques Roadshow, ordering their Greek pottery on a timeline between the dark ages, the archaic period and the classical period.

## SPARE CHANGE FUNDRAISING RESULTS


**Thank you** for all your contributions towards our PTA Fundraising Commemorating D-Day 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary
