What have we been learning this week?		
EYFS	Class 1	
This week in Early Years we have been reading the book "The Imaginative Gardener". We have used our own imaginations to design our own plants and insects. Reception have written simple sentences about their plants. In RE we have started to learn about special places in other religions. We learned about what happens in a Mosque. In maths, nursery have been learning about 2D shapes and reception have been learning about addition stories	Class 1 have begun reading a new story this week "The Storm Whale". we have really enjoyed thinking about Noi and his father, how they were feeling and describing the things that they did. We are continuing to grow our plants and some have begun to produce shoots! We are excited to continue to measure as they grow to track their progress.	
Class 2	Class 3	
This week in Class 2 we have really enjoyed writing diary entries in role as one of the characters from our whole class text "The Abominables" by Eva Ibbotson. In Art we had a fantastic time finding objects that we could use to create our birds nest sculptures with. In our history lesson we learnt about day to day life as a Viking in Britain and for RE we continued looking at how Christians advertise the church to new members.	Class 3 have had an exciting week this week! They have all written up their final copy of their narratives. In maths, they have finished their unit on shape. In computing the children trained a programme to recognise and classify different objects in the classroom. We also learned about voice recognition and sound waves using 'Audacity'. In art, we began designing our own colour/ light boxes in the style of Carnovsky. We will begin making these on Friday. The children learnt about positive ways to manage stress in PSHCE and they designed their own 'well-being wheel' to support them when they feel challenged.
