This week, as every week, there has been a lot going on in school. On Monday the children marked Remembrance Day in school with a special collective worship that included a 2 minute silence together to remember fallen and serving members of the armed forces. On Tuesday year 5 &6 welcomed our Police Liaison officer Martin Powell into school for the first time. He spoke to them about online safety and how to be safe and responsible online, including discussion on use of social media and messaging. I have also asked Martin to come to school on the evening of 11<sup>th</sup> December (6.30pm) to run a parent workshop on Online Safety. He will share the presentation and information that he went through with the children and there will also be an opportunity to discuss wider issues around online safety with you all. All parents are welcome and more information will be sent out nearer the time.

This term we are trailing a new approach to teacher-run extra-curricular clubs, by running them at lunchtimes instead of after school. This is to try and get a higher uptake from the children and more involvement in clubs. Last half term, despite choosing clubs that children had requested, we were disappointed with the take up. We are hopeful that if they do not clash with existing out of school commitments, clubs or activities, we might encourage a few more children to get involved. After the end of term we will review this and decide some next steps forward for next term. Lunchtime clubs include choir, recorders, board games and young leaders and will start next week and run for 5 weeks. Sporting Influence will continue to run on Monday nights as usual and is currently aimed at KS1 children.

Today was Children in Need and I am delighted to announce that we raised £163.50 through parent pay for this incredibly worthwhile cause. It was great to see everyone joining in in non-uniform and quite a few sets of Pudsey ears! My last bit of news is that next Wednesday morning, one of our music teachers who teaches brass (Mr Woodrow) is offering KS2 children a free 1:1 taster lesson.
