This week in EYFS we have enjoyed reading the book "Duck in a Truck". We have found rhyming words and played rhyming games. We have been exploring different materials and have helped dinosaurs escape from ice cubes. We used cornflour to make gloop and have thought of words to describe the gloop. In the craft area children have made some super trucks for duck.	We've had another fun filled week in class 1 with lots of great learning. We have been sorting toys thinking about the age of the child that would play with them and why, experimenting with chalk pastels and different types of lines, explaining the basic needs of living things and writing our own stories.
