This week in Early Years we have enjoyed starting our new topic "Amazing Africa". In maths nursery have been looking at the number 6 and reception have been looking at representations of 9 and 10. We have been learning about keeping our teeth healthy and have used playdough to support our play as dentists.

Already they have learned a whole story and have really looked carefully at the characters, their feeling and the events that happened. In our history lesson we looked at 6 pieces of evidence from the time of the moon landings and discovered lots of information, such as when the moon landing was, how nay astronauts there were and how many astronauts actually walked on the moon. In our art lessons we have begun by "drawing what we can" see in preparation for some work about printing.
