What have we been learning this week?			
EYFS Link to website class page This week we have enjoyed finishing our work on The Bog Baby. We have made some detailed maps to help others find the magic pool. In maths we have begun looking at shapes. We have looked at how shapes appear to change when they are rotated. In science we have learned about the life cycles of a frog and we have confidently used the scientific names for each part of the cycle. In RE we have been naming different parts of a church.	Class 1 Link to website class page Class 1 have had a fantastic week writing some amazing stories, we hope that you were able to come along to the special assembly to see and hear some of them. Everyone has worked so hard to write their own story and to read and present their work. In maths the year 1 children have moved on to learning about fractions and have begun by cutting shapes in half. The year 2 children have begun learning about time and have begun by making a clock and practising telling the time to O'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past that they learned when they were year 1.

For our maths work we have been working on statistics, on Monday we made a tally chart of all the different varieties of tree we have on our school field and produced bar charts linked to our Forest Schools learning, then on Tuesday we measured the length of a shadow at various points during the day and created a table and a line graph. In English we began a short unit on a short film called "Spy Fox" we have had great fun describing Spy Gadgets then writing a persuasive advert for them.	Class 3 Link to website class page Class three has had a very busy week with year 6 completing their SATS. Year 5 have been amazing working in a different classroom out of routine. We have continued our geography topic and had an art afternoon to complete our printing art project. Year 5 have learnt about fossils and different layers of the earths crust in science, making their own models using sweets (that they couldn't eat!!!) Meanwhile both year groups enjoyed a large game of ro-icket for their PE this week.
