Entitlement and enrichment in EYFS

In order to ensure that all children in EYFS encounter high quality learning experiences, based on our 5 curriculum principles (literacy rich, enquiry – led, outdoor learning, Christian values and first-hand learning experiences) we will ensure that by the end of EYFS all children will have experienced:

- Harvesting fruit and vegetables from our school garden and eating these foods.
- Planting bulbs in the autumn
- Planting seeds in the spring
- Going on an autumn walk to find seeds and leaves
- Making a Christingle (with a special grown up) and taking part in a Christingle service/assembly
- Taking part in and stand on the stage in a Nativity Play
- A visit from Father Christmas and a Christmas party
- Baking buns to celebrate their birthday
- Playing in the snow
- A visit from Rev Susanne to take part in either a class wedding or baptism
- A visit to a Christian place of worship (Baldersby Church or Ripon Cathedral) to learn about a special building
- Taking an active role in a church service (Christmas or Easter)
- A visit to a library
- A village walk to support learning about our local area
- A visit to Dishforth Garden Centre
- A visit from our Community Police team to talk about Stranger Danger
- A range of ICT hardware and software applications
- A weekly child led forest schools session
- Exploring the life cycle of a living things (eg tadpoles, caterpillar/butterflies, chicken eggs)
- A teddy bears picnic
- A visit an attraction within an hour of school, travelling on a coach and taking a packed lunch
- Write and post a letter
- Hold a scary beast – visit from Aquatic Finatic
