Class News

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have been looking at the book 'Each Peach, Pear, Plum'. We have found all the rhyming words and learnt some of the nursery rhymes, such as 'Jack and Jill' and 'Old Mother Hubbard'. We have sorted shapes into groups and learned about the properties of triangles. We also talked about Remembrance Day and carried out several poppy activities.

Class 1 – In Class 1, we have been looking at the story 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We have worked hard on using our sounds to help us spell words. In Maths we have been learning about number bonds. On Wednesday we focused on Remembrance and learnt about why people wear poppies.

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have begun a short English topic writing instructions on how to bake a 'Monster Pizza'. Year 4 have begun looking at measure in Maths while Year 3 continue their work on addition and subtraction. Our Geography learning has been about volcanoes and in Science we investigated animal bones.

Class 3 – In Class 3 we have started a new book called, 'There's a Boy in the Girl's Bathroom.' We have developed our understanding of division and factors. During Music and Computing we have begun to record a musical accompaniment to an animation and we have developed hockey skills in P.E.

Local Authority update: messages from Public Health for parents / carers

On Friday evening, through the Local Authority update, Public Health England have requested that the following messages are passed onto parents / carers:

- Please ensure that you maintain social distancing from others when dropping off and collecting your child from our school. Please follow any guidance issued by us to help with this e.g. only one adult per family should enter school grounds to drop off or collect.
- For those travelling by car we ask that you wait in your car until your specific drop off time. This will reduce the amount of people assembling in and around the school grounds and will help with social distancing.
- We recommend that all parents/carers entering the school premises (and in other congested areas around school premises) wear a face covering in addition to social distancing. This an extra safeguard to reduce the transmission of the virus. Please note that this does not apply to those who are medically exempt.
- You must keep at least two metres apart from other parents/carers at all times. Where you are unable to do so, wear a face covering.

Messages for parents/carers to talk to their children about:

- Limit the number of people they walk to/from school with.
- Please remind your child to leave school in a timely manner to avoid social contacts.
- Please make sure your child attends school in usual uniform with an appropriate coat for winter conditions.
- Please remember the school 'bubbles' do not apply outside of school (i.e. children should avoid mixing with friends outside of school, even if they are in the same 'bubble' at school).

Message to pass on to parents/carers about self-isolation:

If you are self-isolating:

- Please ensure that if you or a member of your family has Covid symptoms or has been asked to self-isolate (e.g. if they are a close contact of someone who has tested positive) that you and your household follow the self-isolation guidelines.
- Please do not send a child to school if they or a member of their household has symptoms, or if they have been asked to self-isolate.
- Please follow the national guidance:

In summary:

- You can leave home for education (formal provision, rather than extracurricular classes such
 as music or drama tuition,) training, registered childcare and children's activities that are
 necessary to allow parents/carers to work, seek work, or undertake education or training.
 Parents can still take their children to school, and people can continue existing
 arrangements for contact between parents and children where they live apart.
- You and your children must not meet people socially. However, you can exercise or meet in a public, outdoors space with people you live with, your support bubble (or as part of a childcare bubble), or with one other person.
