Dear Parents / Carers

I hope you all enjoyed the half term week despite the wild, windy, wet weather. There is much to look forward to in school over the forthcoming weeks as the children continue their learning and prepare for the run up to Christmas.

Class News

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – Last week the children in EYFS were learning about autumn. We looked at all the different coloured leaves we could see. We enjoyed reading the story of Leaf Man and following his adventures when he got blown by the wind. We made our own Leaf Men out of leaves we collected.

Class 1 – Class 1 have enjoyed learning about the human body in their science lessons. Children learnt about the parts of the body and used books and the internet to find out interesting facts. Using this information, children wrote their own human body fact books. We have also been working hard on our handwriting making sure all our letters are formed correctly and sit on the line. In R.E children have been learning about Mosques and have begun to design and make their own.

Class 2 – Thank you for all of your hard work last week. In English we looked at writing the climax to our Stone Age stories. Our Maths work was based on Addition and Subtraction problems. In Geography we looked more closely at Sri Lanka and created colourful posters all about the country and in Science we looked at classifying different types of animals. I look forward to welcoming you all back into Class 2 this week.

Class 3 – During Remote Learning, Class 3 students created and described a sea monster. They then planned and wrote a 'Terrible Tale of the Sea' with their sea monster as a main character. We are looking forward to sharing these short stories back in class. On the theme of the sea, for art, they made a picture of the sea after having looked at examples of famous artists' work. We will add these to our class art gallery. There was a lot of great learning done in maths about multiples, factors and prime numbers.

Nursery Places at Dishforth C of E Primary School



This is the time of year when parents with three and four year old children start to consider where they would like to send their children to school in the following September. Please can you make your family and friends aware that we are still offering visits to see our Early Years unit and these visits can be arranged by contacting the school office.

In order to help us with our forward planning, we would also be grateful if parents with younger children could give us an indication of when they expect their children to join our nursery or reception class. All children are able to access 15 hours of funded nursery sessions from the term after their 3rd birthday. 30 hours of funded sessions are also available if you meet the criteria (based on number of hours worked). We also provide parents with the option to pay for sessions for children who have turned three but do not qualify for funded sessions yet (e.g. for a child born in May, who would not qualify for funding until the September, we could offer sessions during the summer term, but these would need to be paid for). Nursery children are also able to attend our

Before and After School club if extended care is needed. Please could you contact the school office with this information.

Applying for a School Place for September 2021 – Moving from Nursery to Reception

If your child was born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017 they are due to start school in 2020-21. The <u>primary school application</u> round is now open and <u>the deadline to apply is 15th January</u> 2021.
