### Newsletter 17 Monday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2021

Dear Parents / Carers

Thank you for your support and understanding last week over the treacherous conditions on Thursday and Friday that resulted in school closure. I am hoping for a quiet week on the weather front this week.

#### **Class News**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week in EYFS we have been looking at hibernation. We have found out about animals that hibernate and found different ways to make the spikes on hedgehogs in our art work. In maths we have continued to work on our numbers to five and we are all doing really well at saying how many objects we can see without counting.

**Class 1** – In Science this week, Class 1 took part in a material hunt to find objects made of different materials. In Literacy, children have been planning and writing their own story based on the book '**The Way Back Home**' by **Oliver Jeffers**. In maths this week, Year 2 children have worked hard to develop their understanding of multiplication, whilst Year 1 children have developed their understanding of number by comparing and ordering numbers.

**Class 2** – In class 2 this week we have continued our reading our class text "Charlotte's Web". Through the text we have explored concepts such as Animal Rights, Growth Mindset and anthropomorphism. For maths we have continued our work on multiplication and division, this week starting to look at numbers larger than 12. We explored what life was like on the Home Front during WW2 and designed our own propaganda posters for History. In music this week we explored pulse and in Science we investigated how the size and shape of Shadows changes depending on the distance from the light source.

**Class 3** – This week Class 3 we have begun reading *Journey to the River Sea* and exploring the main character, Maia. We, also, investigated the life of the author, Eva Ibbotson. In maths, we have been reading from and drawing line graphs. Our science was to find out about seed dispersal and then investigate the flight of paper seeds by applying our maths skills. We found out about two different places in the *Amazing Americas* for topic work. We drew careful sketches from photographs of Manaus in 1910, for art, to help us to make links between our literacy and topic work.

This had been suspended temporarily due to the school closure as part of Lockdown.

We have been advised today that the scheme is going to resume on Wednesday so please can you send a piece of fruit into school for your child / children to eat at tomorrow playtime and then the fruit will be school. Thank you.
