Dear Parents / Carers

I hope you had a lovely weekend and were able to take advantage of the beautiful weather we are enjoying at the moment.

Class News

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have started our new topic on Africa. We have enjoyed starting to look at our new book *Anna Hibiscus' Song*, learning about Anna's life in *Amazing Africa*. We have found out what yams are and have had a go a pounding yams. We have been learning the air sound and have set up a hairdresser's role play area. In maths we have learned how to make the teen's numbers using Numicon, and have been practicing ordering numbers up to 20.

Class 1 – Class one has been reading and writing nature poem. Children have work hard to learnt a poem off by heart and have worked in groups to write nature poems. In science we have begun our learning about plants. Children have learnt about the different parts of a plant and their functions. They have also planted a range of vegetables which we are looking forward to watching them grow.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have all settled really well into the new term. We have really enjoyed building simple circuits in science this week, adding bulbs and buzzers to check our circuits are complete. In English we have begun writing a diary entry, writing in role as our characters from the play, imagining how they would feel at the outbreak of World War 2. Year 4 have been looking at increasingly complex problems using decimals this week while year 3 have continued their work on fractions. In our art work with Mrs Appleton we looked at adding silhouettes to a painted jungle background.

Class 3 – This week we have begun our topic about Viking life by developing our own timelines and we have started learning a song for our Macbeth musical. We have been learning about timetables and angles in maths and examining and composing love letters during literacy. During art and design, we made blankets in the style of Gustav Klimt's picture, 'The Kiss', using cotton fabric which we overlaid with a wide variety of art materials including paint, pastel, fabric and beads.

School Uniform

A polite reminder that children need to wear school shoes as part of their uniform. In summer, girls can wear red checked dresses. Again, school shoes are part of the summer uniform as opposed to sandals or flip flops. Children still need practical footwear for school that protects their feet and allows them to move / run about safely.

Sun Cream

Please can I ask parents to ensure the children have sun cream applied to them before they come to school in the morning when the forecast is due to be sunny and also please do send into school a bottle of sun cream labelled with your child's name on it so that they can apply it when necessary over the summer months – thank you.

As many of you know, we are working on expanding the number of non-fiction books we have in school and our aspiration is to have a full lending library in place for the children.
