It looks like we are going to have a wet week weather wise this week so please ensure children have a coat with them!

<u>Welcome</u>

A very warm welcome to Bobby, Bibi and Denny who have joined our school family today in Year 1 and Nursery.

Class News

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week we have enjoyed reading the story of Handa's Surprise. We have explored all the different types of fruit that Handa took to her friend, including squeezing oranges to make juice for snack time. We have talked about healthy eating. We made a story map of Handa's Surprise and have practised retelling the story in order, in preparation for story writing next week. In maths we have been thinking about shape and spatial awareness.

Class 1 – This week class 1 have been learning about continents. They have learnt to locate these on a world map and have begun to create an information book about each one. In P.E children have continued to work on developing their tennis skills. They have been learning how to hold a racket correctly, throw underarm and hit the ball.

Class 2 –In Class 2 this week we have looked closely at a variety of war time poetry and developed our understanding of the vocabulary used. We made switches and added them into our circuits in our science lesson and in RE we looked at how the 5 pillars of Islam guide Muslims through their journey of life. On Tuesday we investigated the social hierarchy of the Shang Dynasty and looked in depth at how each group of people lived.

Class 3 – In Class 3 we have experimented to differentiate soils by their permeability and their ph. We found out about how Danegeld was used during Viking invasions to try to keep the Vikings away and we learnt how to say more of our hobbies in French. We did our first read through of our Macbeth play script and explored the characters of the three witches through art and descriptive language. We have been learning the third of the songs for our Macbeth musical: 'Temptation' which has a swing/blues style. Within this, we have enjoyed trying vocal improvisation by 'scat' singing - using nonsense words such as doo-be-doo, bad-u-wa.

Parliament Workshop – Class 3

On Thursday Class 3 are going to take part in a live virtual workshop to learn about UK Parliament and its work.

The aim of these experiences is to enhance our curriculum in school and the children will complete the passports in school throughout their time with us. Advance Notice – start and end of school day timings

It is hoped that during the second half of the summer term, restrictions around social distancing will be lifted with an anticipated date of the 21st June. If all goes to plan and this turns out to be the case, we would hopefully be able to have one start and finish time in the school day instead of the current staggered system.

Therefore, when schools are allowed to cease with the staggered system, the start time at Dishforth CE Primary will be 8.45am and the school day will finish at 3.15pm. I will of course keep you informed with the exact date this will be implemented as the term progresses and we are all hoping it will be from Monday 21st June.

End of key stage assessments - Year 2 and Year 6

As you will be aware, the national curriculum assessments due to be held in summer 2021, including tests for children in Year 2 and Year 6 and also the Year 1 phonics screening check, have been cancelled.

Assessment in school happens all the time - during every lesson, teachers are assessing how the children are meeting the objectives set and they keep records of this throughout the year that capture this formative assessment. In addition to this, every term in line with the school's assessment policy, children take a summative assessment in reading and maths which is used to support judgements.

Children in Years 2 and 6 will continue to be assessed as they have been throughout the year and they will also have the opportunity to take a past assessment paper in order to support teacher assessment at the end of the summer term.
