#### Dear Parents / Carers

What a wonderful weekend of sport we have just enjoyed with very inspirational football and tennis - fingers crossed it continues this week! As we approach the final few weeks of this academic year, it is always a busy time in school with many activities to fit in, so please read on carefully!

#### **Class News**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have patiently waited for our butterflies to emerge from their cocoons - we are still waiting so hopefully it will happen soon. We have done lots of activities based around butterflies and The Very Hungry Caterpillar this week, including making butterfly life cycles, painting and making symmetrical butterflies. We have sorted healthy and unhealthy food and have put the days of the week in order. In PE we have practised different races on the tracks on the school field.

**Class 1** – This week in class, we have been learning about habitats around the world. Children worked in groups to create a poster detailing the plants and animals living in these habitats. In our design technology lesson, we have worked hard to learn how to use a needle to create a running stitch. Children definitely persevered with learning to thread a needle and tie knots! In literacy, we have begun to listen and respond to Aboriginal Dreamtime stories starting with the story of Tiddalik the Frog.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we were very excited to record our production for you all! In our literacy this week we looked at persuasive writing, making links to our class text "The Firework Maker's Daughter". In Science this week we turned our classroom into an Escape Room! We used our knowledge that we have accumulated this term, to answer question that gave us clues to unlock a secret code. It was great fun. In our Geography lesson this week we looked at how China's economy has grown over recent decades and we created bar charts to illustrate where a lot of Chinese exports go.

**Class 3** – It has been a busy assessment week in Class 3. Alongside our assessments, we have been polishing off our Macbeth performance in preparation for it being filmed next week. We have also been designing and making our own comic books telling a summary of the story of Macbeth. During maths we have been looking at coordinates before and after reflections in a mirror line. In our

science session we each described an environment and then invented a creature which was well-adapted to live there.

We are really looking forward to welcoming her to Dishforth CE School and on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July Miss Paterson will be in school to meet the children on the transition morning.

#### **Library Update**

I am delighted to update you all with news that many collections of non-fiction books have been bought for the new school library along with new atlases. We are now in a position to be trained in using the Reading Cloud facility and setting up the Dewey System in the library area. We are seeking to have an official opening in the autumn term and we will be continuing to raise money in order to keep adding books to the collections. A huge thank you to everyone who has generously supported this throughout the year.

#### **COVID Restrictions**

As you know, COVID restrictions are remaining in place until the 19<sup>th</sup> July. My understanding is that details surrounding the lifting of restrictions will be outlined this evening. Following this, schools usually receive separate guidance from the DfE and then from North Yorkshire. When we have further details and clarification I will share our plans with you about the last week of the academic year and also plans for September.

**Productions:** Class 2's production of Edith's Wartime Scrapbook was sent out to their families on Friday and Class 3's production of Macbeth will be sent this week.

**Transition:** A whole school transition session will now take place on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July in the morning where the children will have the opportunity to spend some time with the class teacher they are going to have in September.

**Sports Day and Leavers' Assembly:** Sports Day and the Leavers' Assembly are scheduled for the last week of term and these will go ahead as planned. Sports Day is on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> July at 10am and the Year 6 Leavers' Assembly is on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> July at 2pm for the Year 6 children and their parents.

**Start and end times of the school day:** the staggered start and end times of the school day will remain in place for the rest of this term. It is hoped that in September we will be able to have one start and one finish time as previously shared in past newsletters: 8.45am - 3.15pm. Details will be shared before we break up for the summer when we receive information from the DfE.
