Dear Parents,

I hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas and happy start to the New Year.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families and the last week of term was certainly a very busy one!

EYFS – This week we have embraced everything Christmassy! We have enjoyed playing class 3's Christmas games. The children enjoyed independently visiting each stall, listening to the rules of the games and having a go. We have been practising our Christmas songs ready for our Christingle service. The children enjoyed making their Christingle and learning about the different parts.

Class 1 – In Class 1, we have had a fantastic week with Christmas parties, making different Christmas crafts, having Christmas dinner and we even received an exciting visit from a very special visitor! In Maths and Numeracy, we have revised what we have learnt in place value, addition, subtraction and multiplication. In Literacy, we have continued our creative story, 'A Necklace of Raindrops' and focused on the different features of an apology letter. We have been using what we have learnt so far to write our own letters to one of the characters in the story, The North Wind. In Science, we have been finishing of our materials project and have showed off what we have learnt. In Topic, we have also been learning more about The United Kingdom and the different countries that make up the U.K

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have prepared for our Christingle service by creating our Christingle Oranges and practicing our songs. On Monday we really enjoyed playing Class 3's games that they had spent a lot of time creating. In English we have written a backstory for the character Ebanana Scrooge from a Christmas Carrot, thinking about what it was that made him so mean. In our Maths learning we have looked at different representations of multiplication and exploring commutativity. Have a fantastic Christmas break and I look forward to seeing you in the New Year.

Class 3 – This week in class, we have continued to develop our knowledge and adding and subtracting fractions. In our art lesson, children created calendars using their printing skills. On Monday, Class 3 had the opportunity to share their Christmas games with other classes. It was lovely to see them take on this responsibility. Well done children for all your hard work! In music, children have worked hard on their singing skills and have been busy practising songs for the Christingle. Children enjoyed making their Christingles in preparation for the service.

Updated Covid Guidance

Guidance has been updated over the Christmas period with regards to Covid – particularly around self-isolation and contacts:

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for Covid-19 has been reduced to 7 days provided there are two negative LFD tests on day 6 and day 7.

The updated guidance includes a link to the most up to date public health advice on self-isolation. The full self-isolation period is 10 days, however if an individual gets a negative LFD test result no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and a further negative test 24 hours later (day 7) then the individual no longer needs to complete the full 10 days and may end their self-isolation after the second negative test provided they do not have a high temperature. This also applies to children under 5, "with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion".

Daily testing for close contacts for Covid-19

The public health advice also states that those close contacts who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months "should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time".
