Children's Mental Health Week – this week

This year Children's Mental Health Week by Place2Be is celebrating with the theme of Growing Together. The theme is about encouraging children (and adults) to consider how they have grown, and how they can help others to grow.

Growing Together is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. Challenges and setbacks can help us to grow and adapt and trying new things can help us to move beyond our comfort zone into a new realm of possibility and potential. However, emotional growth is often a gradual process that happens over time, and sometimes we might feel a bit 'stuck'.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in Early Years we have been learning about the story of The Great Race, and have learned about how the Chinese New Years are named after animals. We have learned that this year is the Year of the Tiger and have made tiger masks. We have looked at how noodles change when you cook them and have used vocabulary to describe uncooked and cooked noodles. In maths we have been comparing 6, 7 and 8 as well as looking at ordinal numbers (first, second, third etc)

Class 1 – In Class 1 this week, we have started to look at 'The Jolly Postman or Other People's Letters' by Alan Ahlberg. We looked carefully at homophones and what they mean. We then identified examples in the text and wrote our own re telling of the story. In Maths, we have focused on addition and division. Year 1s have been learning about number bonds and how they can add by making ten. Year 2s have been learning to share and make equal groups, using the division symbol.

In Science, we have been learning about Survival. We identified the three basic needs that all animals, including humans require to survive. We then researched different kinds of animals and put the information into our own fact files. Finally, in RE we continued to explore what it means to be Jewish. We looked at the Maccabee Brothers and why Jewish people celebrate Hannukah.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have started a mini topic all about how Bees make honey. We have looked at the features of an explanation text and also looked at the type of vocabulary needed to write one.

In Maths this week we have continued our work on multiplication and division, looking at increasingly tricky numbers. We tested ourselves in swimming this week, learning different strokes and in Gymnastics we have been working on different rolls. Our topic lesson this week was all about Hadrian's wall. We looked at the reason for why the wall was required and we looked at the geography of it, paying attention to some of the Towns and Cities built along the wall.

Class 3 – Class 3 have been having a lot of fun with our literacy book (Darwin's Dragons). We have looked at deeper messages within the book and had opportunities for some debating about some key characters. In maths, we have finished looking at fractions, decimals and percentages and are moving onto measurements next week. In topic, we have researched the Eden project and investigated the ecosystems within this artificial biome. Earlier this week, we have had a visitor reminding us of how to keep safe online. Class three have finished our week, looking at where some foods come from in DT.

Safer Internet Day – Tuesday 8th February

Safer Internet Day 2022 will be celebrated on 8th February with the theme 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'.

From gaming and chat, to streaming and video, young people are shaping the interactive entertainment spaces they are a part of. Safer Internet Day 2022 celebrates young people's role in creating a safer internet, whether that is whilst gaming and creating content, or interacting with their friends and peers.

This term, Class 1 will be taking part in an exciting project called 'The Young Leaders Award' (YLA). The Award has strong links to British Values, PSHE, Citizenship, RE and SIAMS and focuses on growing the characteristics of kindness, perseverance, teamwork and action. The children will take part in engaging activities including a song, big discussion questions, famous leader stories, Bible stories and they will interview community leaders. The pupils will take part in 3 school challenges and a community action project to put their kindness, perseverance and teamwork into action.

We'll look forward to sharing what we have learnt with you.
