### Newsletter 2 Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022

Dear Parents / Carers,

The children have had a super first week back at school. They have settled back into routines very well and there has been a lovely, purposeful atmosphere in school.

Like you all, we, as a school community, are deeply saddened by the death of the Queen last Thursday and, through this period of national mourning, we are talking with the children about the Queen's life and her dedication to the country and the Commonwealth as well as discussing their own thoughts and feelings. We are all very aware of the significance of the past few days and coming weeks as a marker in history and as you will know, next Monday is the State Funeral of Queen Elizabeth II and school will be closed on the 19<sup>th</sup> September, re-opening on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September.

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have all been settling into our new class. We have been learning our new routines and rules. We have been thinking about our feelings and the feelings of others, looking at the story of The Colour Monster. We have explored all the areas of the classroom and have made good progress in tidying up at the end of each session. We are all looking forward to our first full week next week and taking part in a PE and forest school session.

**Class 1** – Class 1 have settled into school really well and have been enjoying exploring their new classroom. We have been learning how to use each area and how to work independently. We have begun with the story of the Colour Monster, learning about different feelings and thinking about our own feelings. We have learned strategies to keep calm and what to do if we become upset or angry. In maths we have been counting. Year 2 have been learning to read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and words and Year 1 have been focussing on correct number formation to 10 and learning how to represent numbers using a tens frame. We have begun our geography topic by making a map of our classroom and practised describing where the different areas are using geographical vocabulary.

**Class 2** – We have had a wonderful first week back in Class 2. It has been lovely to welcome the children into class and get to know the Year 3 children better. We have enjoyed learning about

the Artist Paul Cezanne in our Art lesson and starting to understand more about the Stone Age. In English we created characters and setting that can help us in our writing this year.

**Class 3** – What a fantastic start back at school! Class 3 have settled back into school incredibly well and have welcomed some new children into our class. We have been looking at Roman numerals and place values in maths. Some of us have been challenging ourselves to use Roman numerals outside of our maths lessons too. In literacy the children have been writing a recount, learning all about the different features and telling me about the exciting things they have experienced in their holidays. In history and geography, the children have begun telling me everything they know about transport beyond 1066 and their knowledge of Europe.

# <u>Homework</u>

Homework begins this week. Materials to support homework – spelling tips and paired reading - are attached to this newsletter. ## <u>Swimming Class 3 – September – this Thursday</u>



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 5 and Year 6 children start on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> September**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions

or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. After Christmas children in Years 3 and 4 will go swimming.

The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week**, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments must be made on your Parent Pay account. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.
