Dear Parents / Carers,

As Advent started yesterday, we are very much looking forward to this period of time in school. Our Advent wreath will be lit, the hall boards changed to a Christmas Carol theme and we will be decorating the Christmas tree later this week. We have much to look forward to as we head into the festive season so please read the newsletter carefully to see what we have planned. Children can now bring Christmas cards in on a Monday or Tuesday and they will be delivered later in the week.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in Early Years we have enjoyed reading the book "Whatever Next" by Jill Murphy. We have answered questions about the story and written a list of things we would take into space. We have made space rockets in the junk modelling area, developing our scissors and joining skills. In maths nursery children have been making repeating patterns and Reception have been learning about 1 more and 1 less than numbers to 5. We are busy practising our nativity play.

Class 1 – This week Class One have been thinking about Christmas and what it means to Christians. We have been working hard to perfect our Nativity performance, the singing is sounding great! We have been making toy time lines and discussing how toys have changed throughout the years. In maths we are beginning a new topic of shape and have been having a great time naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes. We are writing instructions in our English lessons about making a magic hat and soon we will be writing some instructions to make a magical invention to help Leaf return home from the island he got stuck on.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have really enjoyed looking at the features of an information text and have begun to write one all about the formation of sedimentary rocks. In maths this week Year 4 have begun looking at shape and area while year 3 have continued their work on column addition and subtraction. We investigated where the best area for pre-historic people to settle would be in Geography and in DT we carefully used craft knives to cut out nets for our 3D shapes. In computing we continued to design the coding for our times tables games.

Class 3 – Class 3 have begun designing their stalls for the Christmas fair this week. They have also designed and tested some parachutes in science as part of their topic about forces. The children have tried out a new times table challenge in the class, where they have to answer questions on whiteboards before the end of the theme tune finishes. Well done Molly for completing it! We have also been multiplying and converting fractions from improper fractions to a mixed number. In literacy, the children finished planning their diary entries and have started to write them. They will be looking at how to write a script for their filmed advertisements for the beginning of next week.

Mini-Medics

On Thursday Class 3 children took part in mini-medics training where they learnt important First Aid information and life-saving techniques.

Forest Schools

All the children in school will be undertaking Forest Schools at some point through the academic year. Forest School is an inspiring process which is a specialised approach that aims to develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning outside.

Children in **Class 3** are going to be undertaking Forest Schools after Christmas on a Tuesday. Please can children bring into school a waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and trainers / wellies – something that you don't mind getting wet and dirty!!

Swimming Class 2 – January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 3 and Year 4 children start on Thursday 12th January**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions

or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week**, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments must be made on your Parent Pay account. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are heading towards winter:

- An email will be sent to all families
- County Hall will be informed.

Hopefully, this will not happen this winter but I feel it is better to be prepared.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails.
