Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week we have continued our learning on light and dark. We have been painting owl pictures following simple instructions. We have explored what it is like to be in the dark, whilst in our dark den. We thought about how being in the dark makes us feel. We then used different light sources, such as glow sticks and torches to light up the dark den. In PE we started our gymnastics lessons. We learned how to sit like a gymnast and how to make different body shapes. We have been learning about the number 2 in nursery and the numbers 4 and 5 in reception in our maths sessions. We are trying to recognise groups of objects without counting.

Class 1 – This week in class 1 has been all about diary writing. We have written a page from the diary of Leaf, a polar bear who woke up one morning to find that his iceberg had floated to a new island. We have also been learning how to write in the past tense. We have continued to find out about toys and have looked at what toys were like 30 years ago and how they were different to now. We are really enjoying our PE lessons where we are learning gymnastics, we have already learned how to balance, make a sequence of moves and roll. We have started our RE topic of "Why does Christmas matter to Christians" and have begun thinking about the birth of Jesus and understanding why this story is important to Christians.

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have really enjoyed our mini guided reading topic of remembrance. We have looked in detail at the Christmas Day truce and the thoughts and feelings of the soldiers at that time. We finished the week looking into the history of the Poppy. In Science this week the class looked at the melting point of chocolate and in History we looked in further detail at the different Stone Age periods drawing similarities and differences. Finally, we absolutely loved our Forest Schools lesson where we used hand drills to make Conker Caterpillars!

Class 3 – In class 3, this week we have finished writing our narratives about a refugee, in relation to our class book. In maths, Y6 have moved onto fractions, looking at equivalent fractions and fractions on a number line. Y5 have continued learning about prime numbers, squared, and cubed numbers. The children have also used charcoal to create their own piece of artwork, linked to remembrance.

In ICT, they have designed their own computer game and have begun practicing 'hot cross buns' on the clarinet, in music.

Anti-Bullying Week

Anti-Bullying Week 2022 is coordinated in England and Wales by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. It takes place this week and has the theme Reach Out. The week starts with Odd Socks Day today, where adults and children can wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique.

During the week, the children will focus on types of bullying and how to respond if this ever arises.

Crucial Crew

Next Monday, Year 6 are spending the afternoon at Carlton Lodge undertaking activities in Crucial Crew which is an event organised by North Yorkshire Police. The children will see various scenarios which they may encounter in everyday life, each one posing problems or dangers to them. The children, working in small groups and under close supervision will tackle each scenario with feedback given as they complete each one. **All children need to bring a coat**.

Mini-Medics

On the 24th November, Class 3 children are taking part in mini-medics training where they will learn important First Aid information and life-saving techniques.

Ribbons


EYFS – This week the ribbon goes to someone who has tried very hard with learning their sounds and writing letters. They have been a good friend to everyone this week – Well done Oliver!
