Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a super weekend.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have started our new topic on Light and Dark. We have enjoyed reading our new story Owl Babies. We have retold the story using a story map and actions. In maths we have been learning about 2 D shapes, and position of objects, using mathematical vocabulary. We have made baby owls out of playdough and have fed baby owls' worms (spaghetti worms).

Class 1 – This week in class 1 we have started a new story called Leaf. We were very excited to read a story about a polar bear called Leaf, so we decided to find out as much information about polar bears as we could. We have used information books, a dicto-gloss and factual videos to learn all about polar bears. We have also learned the features of an information text and begun writing our own about polar bears. We are also learning about the history of toys. We have started by learning about the toys that we have now and will be working to create a timeline of how toys have changed over the last 100 years.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have worked on subtraction. Looking at subtracting across, tens, hundreds and thousands. We have begun reading our new class text "The Pebble in My Pocket", we have written poetry, made predictions and created some artwork based on the opening of the story. In History this week we compared different periods of the Stone Age and today, thinking about how the evolution of technology is closely linked to the evolution of humans. Our new Geography topic is all about how humans use settlements.

Class 3 – Class 3 have made a great start back at swimming this week. The children are really enjoying the lessons and setting a lovely example for our school. The children have been revisiting some knowledge in geography playing European top trumps. In maths, they have been doing the four operations. In literacy, they practiced writing different story openers, which they will later choose for their story.

- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material
