Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a super weekend after a festive-filled week in school with the Nativity Play and Christmas Fair. A huge thank you to everyone who supported the Christmas Fair on Friday by attending and also to Class 3 who spent a lot of time and effort into making the games we all enjoyed playing.

The success of the Fair is down to the organisation and work of Friends of Dishforth, led by Mrs Lynch. Many thanks to all the parents who helped with the Fair preparing the stalls and running them. Overall, £1466.07 was raised for the school which will be used to support the purchase of curriculum resources to support the teaching and learning across school.

Christmas jumper day raised £72.00 which will go to Save the Children. Thank you to everyone who donated.

I can't quite believe we are at the end of the autumn term and break-up on Friday. I hope your preparations are well under way for the festive season and on behalf of all the staff, we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas. We break up on Friday afternoon at an earlier time of 2.30pm and we will look forward to seeing the children on Wednesday 4th January when school opens for the spring term.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week we have been looking at the nativity story. We all enjoyed acting and singing in our nativity play – we hope you enjoyed it! We have continued to think about the nativity play, thinking about the different characters and deciding who was the most important character. We have been looking at texture in art and have made some beautiful pieces of art work for our calendars – I'm sure you will enjoy looking at the calendar over 2023!

Class 1 – This week has been a fantastic week with the Nativity performance and lots of exciting things. We have some future stars in the making! We are working on 2D and 3D shapes in maths with children naming, describing and sorting shapes according to their attributes. In writing we have been writing instructions and the children have worked incredibly hard to include some amazing vocabulary and to re-read and check their work. We have really enjoyed reading and performing our writing to the class. We have begun making calendars and have learned about the seasons as we worked.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have had a great week. On Tuesday we got to meet up with the Year 3 and 4 class from the Dishforth Airfield school and take part in a football tournament. The

competition was closely contested and great fun was had by all. We look forward to meeting up with them again in the future if possible. Also, this week we enjoyed learning all about the boiling and cooling of water with Mrs Blyton and we have begun to look at writing a job advertisement using formal language through the ASDA Christmas advert with Buddy the Elf.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a lovely week showing our adverts to children in the school for the Christmas fair. In literacy we have begun analysing newspaper reports and looking at some different language features that are utilised to inform and persuade the reader. In maths, the children have been finishing their learning on fractions. In art, we have started our calendars ready for the new year. We had a fantastic lesson in RE debating about science vs. creation as part of our topic. The children thought of some contrasting and similar thoughts related to Genesis. They explained their ideas and reasoned with one another well.

Key Stage 2 Sport afternoons with Dishforth Airfield

It was a lovely opportunity for the key stage 2 children to get together with their peers from Dishforth Airfield last week for a sporting afternoon. We are intending to build on this with other sports throughout the year. Well done to the teams from Dishforth CE Primary for winning the tournaments.

PE and Forest Schools after Christmas

Forest Schools

All the children in school will be undertaking Forest Schools at some point through the academic year. Forest School is an inspiring process which is a specialised approach that aims to develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning outside.

Children in **Class 3** are going to be undertaking Forest Schools after Christmas on a Tuesday. Please can children bring into school a waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and trainers / wellies – something that you don't mind getting wet and dirty!!

Swimming Class 2 - January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. Year 3 and Year 4 children start on Thursday 12th January. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions

or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming is £5.00 each week, this is a voluntary contribution which School has already heavily subsidised due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

<u>Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities</u>

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are heading towards winter:

- An email will be sent to all families
- County Hall will be informed.

Hopefully, this will not happen this winter but I feel it is better to be prepared.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails.

Learning would be sent home via the class email system.

Children in Reception and Year 6 are due to get their height and weight checked on the 16th January.


We have also been asked to remind all families that children should have their eyes checked once a year and this is free.
