Dear Parents / Carers,

We have a very busy week in school this week with much to look forward to – please read the newsletter carefully for events and timings.

EYFS and Class 1 are performing their Nativity tonight and tomorrow morning, please can I ask that the children in EYFS and Class 1 arrive back at school at 5.40pm and come to the main entrance in order to get changed into their costumes for the performance.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have loved reading the book "Aliens love Underpants". We have talked about what an alien is and have designed our own pants. We have ordered pants, numbered 1-10 on a washing line. We have spent some time practising our nativity play, and we hope you are looking forward to coming to see it!

Class 1 – Class 1 this week has been very exciting with Nativity rehearsals and our first dress rehearsal! We are all very excited to share our amazing production with you very soon. We have been working hard with our reading, answering questions about the text and investigating new vocabulary. We have begun learning about shapes, both 2D and 3D and are enjoying investigating their properties using some new vocabulary. In RE we are thinking about Advent and how Christians prepare for the birth of Jesus and have made some small Advent wreaths of our own.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 has been assessment week. The children have shown their best selves in completing the assessments to the best of their ability. Also, this week we have been busy putting together our Christmas display for the hall based on the carol "While Shepherds watched their flocks by night." In science this week the children completed an experiment looking at the evaporation and condensation of water and in Geography we looked at how the names of towns and cities reflect their history.

Class 3 – Class 3 have been busy this week, finishing their stalls for the Christmas fair and making advertisements in literacy. They have also been perfecting their skills in music when playing the clarinet. The children have worked incredibly hard this week and have tried their best with some challenges during assessment week. In science, they have created their own parachutes and tested them with Mrs Blyton.

Key Stage 2 Sport afternoons with Dishforth Airfield

Children in Key Stage 2 are visiting from Dishforth Airfield Primary this week to take part in a sports afternoon. Year 5 and 6 children are playing today and Year 3 and 4 children tomorrow. This is a super opportunity for the children to get to know each other and take part in sporting activities.

Key Stage 2 Science – STEM this week

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) **Ambassadors** are people with industry experience or professional knowledge of STEM subjects who volunteer to work with young people to develop their knowledge of how STEM links with the wider world and to inspire young people to follow a STEM future.

During science, Class 3 will be taking part in a live STEM virtual workshop, hosted on Zoom Webinar, to learn about some exciting gadgets and innovations from the world of STEM. They will hear from 3 STEM Ambassadors who actively work on innovations/gadgets/engineering projects, who will each be competing for the number 1 most useful addition to Santa's sleigh. The class will engage with the STEM Ambassadors through the Zoom Q&A function and will get an opportunity to vote in a poll for their favourite gadget.

During Class 2's science session, the children will have an opportunity to watch a virtual STEM Ambassador led workshop investigating what happens to water in the winter, including how water freezes and melts and how this affects the water cycle. The children will then see some exciting experiments with ice cubes, looking at how to keep ice insulated.

PE and Forest Schools after Christmas

Forest Schools

All the children in school will be undertaking Forest Schools at some point through the academic year. Forest School is an inspiring process which is a specialised approach that aims to develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning outside.

Children in **Class 3** are going to be undertaking Forest Schools after Christmas on a Tuesday. Please can children bring into school a waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and trainers / wellies – something that you don't mind getting wet and dirty!!

Swimming Class 2 – January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. Year **3 and Year 4 children start on Thursday 12**th January. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions

or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming is **£5.00 each week**, this is a voluntary contribution which School has already heavily subsidised due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are heading towards winter:

- An email will be sent to all families
- County Hall will be informed.

Hopefully, this will not happen this winter but I feel it is better to be prepared.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails.

Learning would be sent home via the class email system.
