Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a lovely weekend now that the days are drawing out as we head into February this week.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have based our learning on the story of The Gingerbread Man. We have read the story and used a story map to retell the story to a friend. We have made predictions about what will happen if a gingerbread man is placed in water. In maths we have been learning about capacity and have confidently used the vocabulary "full" and "empty". In PE we have learnt how to do a pencil, teddy and forward roll.

Class 1 – In Class 1 this week we have read the story 'Man on the Moon' and written letters to the main character Bob. In science we have been learning about reptiles and in Maths Year 1 have been learning doubles and Year 2 have been working on multiplication and division.

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have enjoyed our English work. We have been looking at writing a non-chronological report on Angler Fish and have developed our vocabulary on all about the deep sea and the appearance, diet and habitat of the fish. In Maths this week we have continued our learning on multiplication and division and in science we created circuits using motors and buzzers. We enjoyed our trip to Thirsk for swimming and in our Art lesson we investigated the work of Henry Moore, a local artist, later this term we will be looking to recreate some of his work using charcoal.

Class 3 - Class 3 have had a brilliant week this week, planning our non-chronological reports about a chosen aspect of WW2. I would like to say a big thank you to all of the parents and volunteers involved in our WW2 day. The children were fully immersed in the 1940's. The children have also learnt about being cryptographers in computing and have created their own codes. They had the opportunity to try different foods from the wartime.



Today we had a fully-immersive experience, going back in time to 1939.

In the morning, we had some brilliant volunteers who came to talk to the children about their personal and their family's experiences of WWII.

The children learnt about: The Glider Pilot Regiment, D-Day and Pegasus Bridge with Major Linegar. They also got to try on some clothing and enquire about artefacts with Mr Lynch. To finish the morning, the children tried some delicacies from the wartime (vegetable stew, spam, corned beef and eggless sponge).

In the afternoon, we had visitors from Lister House and created our own class museum of our artefacts and replica's. Children had a webinar with a survivor of the Holocaust- Peter Lantos. We then created a class film about Dishforth Airfield in WWII.
