Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a lovely weekend. This week we are seeing a return to winter weather with very cold temperatures and we also look forward to our Chinese New Year promotional school dinner on Thursday – there is no need to pre-book this so children can order it on the day.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in Early Years we have started our topic on traditional takes. We have started this topic by reading the book "Each Peach Pear Plum" by Allan Ahlberg. We identified all of the characters in the story as well as going in a rhyming hunt through the book. We thought about all the different places the characters were hiding in the book and used this as a basis for making maps. In maths reception have been making 5 and nursery have been identifying 3.

Class 1 – It has been a busy week in class 1. We have written a story about a boy who flies to the moon, begun new maths topics on money and place value and started programming our own animations using scratch on the I-pads! Everyone has enjoyed learning more about the moon landings and Scotland and we have learned about the artist Charles Rennie Mackintosh ready to do some of our own art work inspired by him.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have begun our swimming lessons. We enjoyed travelling to Thirsk on the coach and getting into the water. We look forward to improving our swimming each week. In Maths this week we have been looking at multiplication and division. Year 3 have been looking at the 3- and 4-times tables and Year 4 have been looking at the 12s. In English this week we have looked at adding suffixes to root words and looking at describing settings and action sequences. In computing we have loved looking at MicroDot computers. Over the next few weeks, we are going to develop and programme them.

Class 3 – Class 3 have enjoyed their first full week back at school. The children in year 6 have begun learning about ratio (which is completely new for them) and have hit the ground running with this new maths work. The year 5 children have been learning about how to add mixed numbers and have been working on their times tables and deepening their understanding of some patterns within these timetables. In English, we have begun reading 'Goodnight Mr Tom' and the children have made inferences on characters and predicted what will happen to the main character William Beech. We have had our first session of Forest School, learning about safety outside and coming up with our own rules and expectations. In PSHE, the children have created a sleep diary, where they are documenting their sleep patterns over the next month.

- Creating a short film about life as a child in Germany during 1939-1945
