### **Newsletter 24 Monday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2023**

#### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have been learning about the numbers 9 and 10 in maths. We have matched pictures with the correct numeral, found two numbers that add up to 9 and 10, and ordered numbers 1-10. On Monday we all enjoyed a visit from Aquatic Finatic. We got to hold snakes, lizards, rabbits, mice and stroke a barn owl. It was a great experience for everyone.

**Class 1** – We have had a great week in class 1. We have worked together to write a class book about birds, presenting our information really creatively and colourfully. We have all been measuring in maths, Year 1 have enjoyed measuring with non-standard units, like cubes, and have learned how to use a ruler to measure in cm. Year 2 have been measuring using their rulers and have been solving problems involving measuring. We have all enjoyed explaining how to measure and what to do to make sure we have measured correctly. We have learned the surrounding seas and oceans of the UK and even linked our science with maths, learning about the human body and comparing hand spans by age.

**Class 2** – In Class 2 this week we have enjoyed completing our Biographical writing about Agatha Christie. We enjoyed revisiting our Geography learning and comparing aspects of Italy and the UK. In science we had fun understanding UV protection and we have also stepped up our rehearsals for our production by getting onto the stage! We can't wait to show you all our hard work in the coming weeks.

**Class 3** - Class 3 have had a great week this week. They have been converting fractions, decimals and percentages and ordering them in ascending and descending order. In English, the children have been planning an emotive letter using informal and archaic language. This is based on a short WW2 film 'Beyond the Lines'. In PE they enjoyed playing games to help them with their passing in rugby. They played a short game at the end of the lesson and have picked up some key rules really quickly. In History, the children learnt about the causes of the war and ordered them from the ones they felt were the most significant cause, to the least. We also watched a video about Britain declaring war on Germany.

## **Year 5 Enrichment Day**

On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> March, the Y5 children had an excellent day at Thirsk High School on their 'Enrichment Day'.

First, they completed a history lesson, creating their own timeline of significant events. Then, they played football on the astro-turf in PE.

After lunch, the children completed a food technology lesson, baking shortbread. They were very tasty. I think we may have some bakers on our hands!

In science the children did a test on the most absorbent biscuit, dipping them into a hot drink. They tested: custard creams, rich tea, chocolate digestives and hob nobs. Y5 also used a stop watch to see which would disintegrate quickest.

At the end of the day, the children looked at metaphors and similes in relation to poetry. The children had to think about someone they knew and describe them in relation to the weather, colour, day of the week, fruit, flower or food.
