Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – The week in EYFS we have been reading the story "Handa's Surprise". We have learnt the names of different fruits that don't grow in our country, as well as the names of different animals found in Africa. We have continued learning about 9 and 10 in maths, as well as comparing the weights of the different fruit. At forest schools we worked in teams to make a house fit for a fairy or mouse – there were some very imaginative houses built! We have also been making special gifts for special people in our lives!

Class 1 – This week we have been learning about lifecycles and have learned about the life cycle of a frog and a butterfly. We have also been busy making our printing blocks inspired by Charles Rene Macintosh. We will soon be layering our prints to make a final piece of work. We have also been working hard on our reading and maths, showing how far we have progressed in the term.

Class 2 – This week in class 2 we have had assessment week. We have enjoyed having the opportunity to show off all that we have learnt this term. Outside of assessment we have continued to learn about fractions in maths. Concentrating on mixed numbers and improper fractions. We have also spent a lot of the week in preparation for our big performance in a couple of weeks. Please make sure you are spending time with the children making sure that they know their lines and are confident about when they need to speak.

Class 3 - Class 3 have been fantastic this week. They have shown great determination and perseverance during assessment week. In the afternoon, they have been outside playing rugby games relating to passing and keeping form in the line. They have also designed their very own sculpture on SketchUp during computing. The children have spent time in the library choosing their favourite books to take home for two weeks. In Design and Technology, they have finished their toy or model using gears and skills they have learnt over the past half term.

'Inspirational Woman' competition for Year 3, 4 and 5 children


Please see the attached poster regarding an essay writing competition for children in Years 3, 4 and 5 about inspirational women. The closing date is Friday 31st March.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
