# Newsletter 31 Monday 15th May 2023

Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all enjoyed the lovely weekend weather. Just a reminder to keep checking diary dates as new dates are being added regularly.

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have been learning about caterpillars in EYFS. We have made observational drawings in our caterpillar diaries of the caterpillars we have in the classroom. In maths we have continued our work on addition, looking at First, Then, Now addition stories. We have had some amazing creations made by the children in the making area this week – pretend face paint boxes, snakes and ladders games and dogs with concertina legs, to name but a few!

**Class 1** – This week we have been very creative in class 1. We have thought about rhyming words and written rhyming verses about Kevin the Koala. We have also been turning paper into feathers which has shown some fantastic drawing skills and creativity! In DT we have been thinking about portion sizes so that we include at least one portion of fruit into our layered fruit desserts when we make them. For maths, in year 1 we have been sharing numbers into equal groups and Year 2 have completed their fractions unit by finding three quarters and counting in quarters and have begun telling the time. What a busy week!

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have begun writing a story from the perspective of one of the characters in our class text "The Boy at the back of the Class" we have thought about his feelings and imagined what it must be like to start a new school in a completely different country. In Maths, year 4 have completed their learning all about decimals, while year 3 have been looking at mass and capacity. In History this week we really enjoyed looking at reasons for people migrating to the big cities despite the health impact it had. For our Geography learning, we wrote a fact file on Brazil. We really enjoyed science with Mrs Blyton this week where we categorised different animals.

Class 3 – Class 3 have been very busy this week! They have been working extremely hard on their SATs tests and Year 5 have been completing learning about long multiplication and have looked at some reading challenges. On Tuesday, they spent time creating a model of coastal features, labelling their previous work. The children have also had a go at composing their own music with our clarinet specialist! Class 3 have enjoyed PE, learning more about relay and sprinting 100m races. They have also had a fantastic afternoon with Mrs Blyton completing investigations in science.

### Class 2 Sport Festival – Wednesday

On Wednesday, Year 3 and 4 children are participating in a multi-skills festival at Outwood Academy Ripon. The children can come to school in their sports kit for the day — white t-shirt, black or navy shorts / tracksuit and trainers. Please can you also ensure that your child/ren is equipped for all weather and has a rain jacket, jumper, sun cream, sun hat and their water bottle as well as an inhaler if they need one for asthma. The children are out for the morning and will be back for lunchtime.

# Mental Health Awareness Week 15<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup> May - information from Mental Health UK

Mental Health Awareness Week takes place from Monday 15 – Sunday 21 May 2023. The official theme for this year, as set by the Mental Health Foundation, is 'anxiety'. The 'Just' Anxiety?' campaign aims to help people and organisations to understand the difference between anxiety and anxiety disorders and to confidently seek and signpost each other to the right support.

Anxiety is a common emotion that we've likely all experienced at some point in our lives. People living with an <u>anxiety disorder</u> will feel intense levels of anxiety frequently, which can deeply impact their quality of life.

Anxiety disorders affect over 8 million people in the UK – that's a little over 1 in 10 of us – and there are lots of different types of them.

When we talk about anxiety, we might dismiss or invalidate it as someone "just worrying" or "just being stressed". These common phrases can be harmful. That's why we want to challenge the notion that it's 'just' anxiety, and share the truths about the condition.

#### **Year 1 Phonic Screen Check**

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
