### Dear Parents / Carers,

What a wonderful weekend of weather we have had! I hope you all managed to enjoy the beautiful sunshine. It looks like we are going to be having a warm week ahead as well so please can I remind everyone to ensure that your child/ren has a base coat of sunscreen on them before they come to school and do send in a bottle of sun cream with their name on to keep in school for these (hopefully) warm months ahead. Children also need a sunhat with them for break times – thank you.

I can't believe we are at the end of another half-term with only one more to go before the end of the academic year. We break up on Friday at the usual time of 3.15pm and, on behalf of the staff, we wish you a relaxing and enjoyable week off. We shall look forward to seeing everyone on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June.

### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week in EYFS we have been learning about butterflies. We have watched our class caterpillars build cocoons around themselves. We have looked at symmetry and made butterflies that have symmetrical wings. In maths we have learnt about doubling and have used the spots on the wings of butterflies to practise our doubling.

Class 1 – Class 1 have enjoyed another busy week. We have been writing our own stories about animals, learning about micro habitats, watching our bean and seed plants grow and much more! Year 1 children are learning about halves and quarters in their maths lessons and Year 2 have been telling the time. We are getting very good at naming the continents and oceans of the world and are starting to learn more about Australia. We have also been investigating how to cut and fold paper to make different types of feathers or wings that we might use when we make our bird models and we have learned how to prepare different fruits by peeling in different ways and cutting. We are very excited to plan, make and evaluate our layered fruit desserts next half term!

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we loved travelling to Outwood school in Ripon to take part in the Multi-Sports festival. We loved taking part in different activities and competing against other schools. In Maths this week Year 3 have been working really hard at looking at addition and subtraction of fractions whilst year 4 have been working with money. Our literacy this week has been all about learning to write instructions, looking at imperative and sequencing verbs. We have really enjoyed computing this week where we began to create our own pieces of music using the Garage Band app on the I-pads. Our RE lesson looked into what the Pentecost meant and how the story has been represented in different cultures.

Class 3 - Class 3 have been busy this week, getting back to normal after the SATs last week. The children in Y5 are working on position and direction, reading coordinates and translating shapes on graphs. Y6 have been working through their shape booklet, using their key knowledge to support their understanding. In English, they have written a recount based on the short film 'Francis'. The children published their work and stained the background of their page - using tea - to make the writing look more authentic. In Clarinet, they were speeding up Hansel and Gretal, playing the piece of music at great speed. They are fantastic musicians! The children have revised French months, numbers and conversational features. In geography, they have created their own fact file about Spurn Point, showing how coastlines can change over time due to severe weather.

### Class 3 Parents / Carers

Miss Ungerechts is holding a parent / carer information session tomorrow at 4pm with regards to the RSE curriculum which is being taught to Class 3 next half term. A letter was sent to families in Class 3 about this two weeks ago with further information on it.

## **National Curriculum Assessments**

### **Year 1 Phonic Screen Check**

Children in Year 1 will take the phonic screen check during the period week commencing 12<sup>th</sup> June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term.

## **Year 4 Multiplication Check**

Children in Year 4 will take the national multiplication check in June during a two-week window commencing on the 5<sup>th</sup> June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term. Please refer to the parent / carer information document which is attached to this newsletter.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
