

Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a super weekend and enjoyed the glorious weather. I am sure you will have seen the forecast for this week and the predicted high temperatures so please can the children all bring sunhats into school along with their water bottle and have a base layer of sun cream on as well. Thank you.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have enjoyed hearing about what adventures the children had over half-term. We have started our new topic "We are off on adventure". This week we have had an adventure into the past, reading the book "Peepo". We have made our own Peepo books and written sentences about what we can see. In maths we have been sharing equally. We have been exploring 3D art further making caterpillar models out of air-drying clay.

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have been continuing our story of Grandad's Island and have written a letter from Grandad to Syd telling him about all of the lovely things he has been doing. In maths year 2 have been learning about statistics, interpreting and drawing different kinds of graphs and year 1 have been looking at how numbers up to 100 are made of tens and ones. In art the children have enjoyed carefully observing and drawing different parts of birds from artwork and have really enjoyed discussing their artwork. In geography we have begun to compare Australia to the UK and have found out that in length Australia is over 4 times longer! We have planted some more seeds to watch them grow and have planned which fruits and other ingredients we will put into our fruit layered desserts.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have had a great week. We loved our Art learning where we have sculpted characters using newspaper and we have begun to use mod-roc to create our sculptures. In Maths this week we have been looking at time. Year 4 have been solving problems using the 24-hour clock, while year 3 have been solving problems to the nearest minute. In English, we have used a film clip to look at enhancing our vocabulary choices and in History we have continued our learning on the Victorian era. Looking this week at the development of the railways. In PE we looked at how we throw a shot put and in Science with Mrs Blyton we looked at our skeletons.

Class 3 - **C**lass 3 have had a fantastic week exploring our new book in English (Town is by the Sea). They have made predictions and inferences about the characters and the theme of mining. The children have been looking at decimals in Y5 and position and direction in Y6. We have also been lucky enough to have Game of Actual Life which is a day of activities linking to real-life situations, including: voting in an election, getting a job, paying taxes, mortgages and passing their driving test. They were a true credit to our school and they set a fantastic example of all of our values throughout the day. Well done Class 3!

Open the Book

On Friday we welcomed Open the Book into school where the team led our Collective Worship with a dramatization of the Bible Story, Jesus Heals a Paralysed Man.

Game of Actual Life

The children in Class 3 participated in a workshop on Wednesday last week. It taught the children about life skills involving getting a job, driving a car, buying houses, taxes, voting in an election and managing money. They added up all of their earnings at the end of a day and enjoyed finding out who was at the top of the "rich list". They had perfect behaviour and won more money because of their fantastic listening.

PCSO visits this week

PCSO Liam Bradbury-Monk from the Ripon Neighbourhood Policing Team is making a few visits this week to speak to the children in KS1 and KS2 on age-appropriate topics such as peer pressure, road safety and stranger danger.

National Curriculum Assessments

Year 1 Phonic Screen Check

Children in Year 1 will take the phonic screen check during this week commencing. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term.

Year 4 Multiplication Check

Children in Year 4 will take the national multiplication check in June during a two-week window commencing on the 5th June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term. Please refer to the parent / carer information document which is attached to this newsletter.

School Uniform

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
