Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a lovely weekend and enjoyed the sunshine. Just a reminder that school is closed for the children this Friday (23rd June) for a staff training day.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have been going on an adventure to the beach. We have talked about what we would need to take to the beach, what we like to do at the beach and how we keep safe. In maths we have been looking at odd and even numbers. We know that some numbers can make pairs and some numbers have one left over. Reception enjoyed a talk by our local PCSO who talked to them about road safety. We have enjoyed taking orders in our ice- café role play.

Class 1 – Class 1 have had a fantastic week. The highlight was making our long-awaited fruit desserts and of course eating them! We have also had a visit from a police officer to help us to understand road safety. In English we have begun a new book called Meerkat Mail and have been enjoying exploring the text and making predictions. We are watching how our seeds progress in science and have written instructions about how to correctly plant a seed and found out exactly what seeds need in order to grow. Our big question in RE is "what makes places special?" and we have talked about places that are special to us and why. We are looking forwards to our class trip soon.

Class 2 – We have had a great week in the sunshine this week. In our PE lessons we have enjoyed learning more about our track and field events. Looking at shot put, javelin and long jump, working in pairs and measuring the length of our attempts. In history this week we were critical thinkers, looking at evidence of whether or not the railways really were a great invention for the Victorians. In RE we looked for evidence of the Kingdom of God on Earth by analysing the Lord's prayer and in Computing we composed our own R&B beats, we really have some budding music producers in Class 2!

Class 3 - Class 3 have worked incredibly hard this week, focussing on our play - Macbeth - and our new book 'Town is by the Sea'. They have considered their roles carefully and listened attentively to some new challenges, with our stage up. The children have researched coalmining, linking to our book. They have also been looking at some investigations in Y6, during maths. In Y5, they have been continuing with decimals, linking it to money. Class 3 have spent some time creating their shields and daggers/ swords for the play. In music, they tried to play a piece of music and then sped it up to add more challenge. Finally, we have been learning about Anglo-Saxon crime and punishment in history.

PCSO visits last week

PCSO Liam Bradbury-Monk from the Ripon Neighbourhood Policing Team made a couple of visits last week to speak to the children in KS1 and KS2 on age-appropriate topics such as peer pressure and road safety. He will be returning soon to speak to the children about stranger danger.

Water Safety

Ripon Fire Brigade visited school this afternoon to talk to the children about the importance of water safety and how to keep safe near the river and the seaside.

Dr Krippner – Ripon Cathedral

Tomorrow, Dr Krippner from Ripon Cathedral will be visiting school to speak to the children about what it is like to be a chorister and to see if any children would like to audition.

<u>Attendance</u>

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
