## Newsletter 33 Monday 5th June 2023

Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a fantastic week off school and enjoyed some sunshine which looks set to continue this week. We have a busy half term ahead as we move towards the end of the academic year with many things to look forward to – please keep checking diary dates at the end of the newsletter.

#### Welcome

A very warm welcome to Hollie who has joined us this week in Year 5.

#### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – In Early Years this week we have been looking at the story "Super Worm" by Julia Donaldson. We have been measuring worms using blocks and making worms using playdough and comparing their lengths. In RE we have been looking at special buildings, in particular a church, naming different things you find in a church. In maths we have been carrying out problems with doubling.

Class 1 – It has been another busy week in class 1. We have begun a new story called Grandad's Island and have been thinking about what the island might be like. We have been working on improving our sentences using adjectives and extra details using words such as and, that and so. In maths year 2 are telling the time and solving problems involving time and year 1 are beginning to learn about position and direction, using their new knowledge of half and quarter to help them to describe turns. We have found out what life was like on Christopher Columbuses ship and learned all about Australia, the children are all getting very good at identifying the continents and oceans of the world.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2, we have enjoyed a busy last week before half term. In Maths year 4 have begun to look at time to the nearest 5 minutes while year 3 are beginning to look at money. In English we have written instructions on how to make a disgusting pizza for a monster, looking specifically at using imperative verbs, sequencing words and adverbs. In computing this week, we explored the piano function on Garage Band, learning to play Happy Birthday. In History we have looked at a description of life in Victorian Britain written by Charles Dickens and thought about how this source of evidence can be used to inform us about the period. In PE we learnt how to hold a cricket bat and we saw how far we could hit the ball. Have a great half term break, we look forward to seeing you back for the last half term of the year.

Class 3 - This week the children in Class 3 have been enjoying practising their end of year performance (Macbeth). They have done a fantastic job learning their lines so far and thinking about their facial expressions and body language when getting into their role. In maths, the Y5 children have finished learning about position and direction, using coordinates to translate and reflect shapes. Y6 have been learning about shape, focusing on angles within polygons. In PE, the children have been finalising their dances for the play with Sam Rich. The children have also painted their weaving during art, looking at floral patterns, forestry and houses in the style of Larry Lerew.

# Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
