Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have had a super weekend. We continue to have a busy couple of weeks ahead before the summer break so please do keep checking the newsletters and diary dates.

We are hoping to carry out Sport Day next Monday (17th) at 1pm – fingers crossed!

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS – This week in EYFS we have been learning about special books as part of our work in Religious Education. We have learned that the bible is the special book for Christians and have listened to and retold the story of Jesus calming the storm. We will be learning about the Muslim special book, the Qur'an, next week. In maths, we have been looking at repeating patterns. Nursery have made simple AB patterns and Reception have made more complicated ABCD repeating patterns.

Class 1 – We've had a fabulous trip this week in Class 1. The children were incredible and really showed great manners and behaviour at Ripon Cathedral. We really enjoyed finding out about different artefacts and how they are used in a Church, and have begun comparing these with artefacts found in a Mosque and thinking about what makes different places of worship special. In writing we have been learning how to describe different places and have been writing postcards as if we have visited lots of different places. In maths Year 1 children have begun telling the time and Year 2 children are busy honing their problem solving and explanation skills in preparation for class 2.

Class 2 – This week we have had a lovely week in Class 2. We have enjoyed finishing off our mod roc sculptures in Art. Decorating our sculptures with paint to look like our favourite characters. In maths year 4 have looked at position and direction, plotting points and shapes on grids, while year 3 have been looking at 3D shapes. In English we have finished writing our story on the flight of a robin and in Geography we looked more closely at the weather and climate in Brazil.

Class 3 - Class 3 have been planning and drafting poems this week. The children analysed narrative poems and sonnets in relation to our topic. They have really enjoyed trying to manipulate rhyming schemes and use figurative language to influence the audience. In maths, Y5 children have been sequencing decimals using their knowledge of addition and subtraction. Y6 children have been looking at fractions and decimals, using investigations to practise their reasoning. In computing the children have designed their webpage and thought carefully about the audience they are trying to attract. In art, we have been using work from Michelle Hughes to cut the lino for their prints. We

have also learnt about Victorian crime and punishment, whilst recapping Ancient Rome, Anglo-Saxon and Tudor crime and punishment.

Class 1 Trip

Class One went on a very special trip to the Cathedral in Ripon. We learned about special places and the symbols that are found in a Church. We made our own crosses, saw lots of symbols and visited the crypt. All of the children behaved very well and learned a lot.



Year 6 Leavers' Assembly – Wednesday 19th July

The Year 6 Leavers' Assembly is taking place on Wednesday 19th July at 1.45pm in the school hall. Please can we ask that no more than two family members join us for this assembly due to the limited space in the hall – thank you.

Class 2 Trip – Ripon Museum

On Tuesday 18th July, Class 2 will be visiting Ripon Workhouse museum where they will be taking part in a rich and poor day. During the day the children will get to experience a mock trial in the courtroom, a tour of the prison cells and meet the very stern matron from the workhouse. Please make sure the children have packed lunch, a waterproof jacket, a hat and sun cream on the day.

Swimming – September



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Class 3 children start on Thursday 14th September**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries

about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. After Christmas children in Years 3 and 4 will go swimming.

The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week**, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments must be made on your Parent Pay account. School has heavily subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Ear-rings in PE

Please can I remind parents of the policy regarding the wearing of ear-rings in PE? Guidance was updated by the Association for PE a number of years ago.

All personal effects should be removed including earrings.

Newly pierced earrings can be removed after a 6-week healing duration. During this period students should be given alternative tasks within physical education such as officiating.

Students unable to remove earrings were previously permitted to make them safe by taping. The guidance on the aforementioned has now changed based on national advice issued by the Association for Physical Education (afPE) 2019. It is now felt that the taping of earrings 'creates a perception of safety and is not recommended', as there have been several incidences within the local authority where children's ears have been injured from earrings being pulled out from under the tape.

Teachers/TAs are not permitted to take out or replace children's earrings if they are unable to do so themselves, therefore, it would be helpful if earrings could be taken out at home on PE days.

If a child has recently had their ears pierced and is unable to remove their earrings, they will not be permitted to take part in the practical aspect of PE lessons for six weeks, after which time they will be expected to remove their earrings in order to participate in PE lessons. During this six-week period the child will be able to take on the role of umpire, referee or coach where appropriate.

Please be aware that this policy will be followed by school staff and Sport coaches.

If your child is going to have their ears pierced, please do so at the start of the summer holidays rather than during term time.

Summer Holidays

School breaks up at 2.30pm on Friday 21st July for the summer break. There will be no after school club on this day.

Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
