# Newsletter 2 Monday 11th September 2023

Dear Parents / Carers,

The children have had a super first week back at school. They have settled back into routines very well and there has been a lovely, purposeful atmosphere in school.

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – Everyone has made a super start to the new school year in Early Years. We have been looking at our feelings using the book The Colour Monster. We have been talking about colours, sorting colours and choosing coloured paint to paint our own Colour Monster. Our children who are in Reception have been very excited to receive their first reading books!

Class 1 – Class 1 have had a fantastic week getting to know each other and settling into a new routine. The year 2 children have been fantastic role models and the year 1 children have been full of confidence and working hard. We have begun learning the story 'A Squash and a Squeeze' and have used some lovely story language, ordered the story and begun thinking about the different characters. In maths we have been learning about the place value of number with year 2 children consolidation their knowledge up to 20 and year 1 children thinking about the number up to 10. We have also begun learning about Alfred Wight in history and different materials in science. It has been a busy and very fun start to the new school year.

Class 2 – Welcome back to Class 2 from the summer holidays. this week we have enjoyed beginning all of our new topics. We have really enjoyed starting our English book of "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane" where we have inferred thoughts and feelings of the main character. In Maths we have started looking at place value and in History we looked at the story of how Romulus created Rome. In Geography we learnt all about the Water Cycle, ready for our new learning about Rivers and Mountains.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a fantastic first week back at school this week. In English, we have begun our class book 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Carroll. The children have all worked incredibly hard in maths, warming up their brains after the holidays, whilst learning about place value. In PE on Thursday, the children completed team building activities and used their communication to support one another. We have started our topic in French, looking at some facial features and colours. In science, the children started their topic about light and looked at the 10 principles of science.

## Homework

#### <u>Swimming Class 3 – September – this Thursday</u>



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Class 3 children start on Thursday**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about

this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. After Christmas children in Years 3 and 4 will go swimming.

The cost of swimming will be £5.00 each week, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments are to be made on your Parent Pay account. School has heavily subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

## **Forest Schools**

I am delighted to welcome Miss Rachel Hunt to Dishforth CE Primary School as Forest School teacher for this year. Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year.

Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2023 - 24 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where

children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots; waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Class 2 will have Forest Schools first on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> October in the afternoon.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
