Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have been reading the story of 'The Colour Monster goes to school' and looking at school routines as we settle in to our own school week. We have also thought of questions to ask the monster. In Reception we have been learning to say and write the new sounds 'a, m, s, d, t'. We have been singing the songs of 'Five little ducks' and 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears' and counting along. We also used colour by numbers to create a colourful bear. In Nursery we have been identifying the sounds objects make in mystery socks. We have been singing One two three four five once I caught a fish alive as well as recognising the primary colours yellow, red and blue.

Class 1 – It has been another fantastic week in class 1 with lots of hard work from everyone. We have enjoyed writing about the story of A Squash and a Squeeze, practised ordering numbers and discussed the vocabulary greater than and less than. In Geography we have been looking at maps of Dishforth and planned a route from the village hall to the school. In science we began learning about different materials, looking carefully at items and noticing what material they were made from. We also discussed the different properties of materials.

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have been working really hard. We have planned and written an alternative chapter for our class text "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane" using setting and character description. In Maths we have worked hard on our place value and in History we learnt all about the story of Romulus and Remus. Our RE this week was all about how God created the world and in PE we have enjoyed learning more Netball skills.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a brilliant week. We have been learning about the power of ten in maths and we have found out more about the fascinations of ancient Egypt in our book during English. The children have written some fantastic descriptions about our main character Lilian using similes, metaphors and personification. In PSHE we have discussed the NSPCC and worries. They also designed some bold and exciting posters for our school expectations and values. The children enjoyed their first football PE lesson and tournament.

Class 2 trip to Aldborough Roman Site - this Thursday

On Thursday 21st September Class 2 will be taking a trip to Aldborough Roman Town near Boroughbridge as part of our History Topic of "The Romans, a local history study". During the day we will look at what life was like in an important Roman Town and investigate how historians today search for relics from the past. Please could children have wellington boots, a coat, hat and sun cream to ensure we are ready for every eventuality weather wise!

NSPCC - Speak out, stay safe programme

Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age-appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom-based activities, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children in Class 3 on Wednesday 27th September. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
