# **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** - This week in EYFs we have been learning about the festival of Diwali. We know that it is a Hindu celebration of light. We have used clay to make Diya lamps and have made Rangoli patterns to welcome people into our classroom. In maths reception children have been learning about triangles and circles. We all enjoyed the number Fun day with Mr Godfrey, especially using the puppets to help us learn our number bonds.

Class 1 – It has been a busy start to the new half term in class 1 with a new book called "The Adventures of the Egg Box Dragon". We have made predictions about what the Egg Box Dragon will look like, made our own Egg Box Dragons, a very big thank you to everyone who brought in your empty egg boxes we wouldn't have done it without you, and have written instructions about how to make Egg Box Dragons. In maths we are working to improve our addition and subtractions skills and our fast recall of number bonds to 10 and 20. In other lessons we have compared life in the 1950s to life now ready for our visit to the Herriot Museum and learned how to make a wheel mechanism in DT.

Class 2 – We have had a fantastic week in Class 2! On Wednesday we absolutely loved having Mr Godfrey in for a number fun day. He taught us fantastic songs and got us all engaged with our maths learning on the 7 times tables, making sure we balance our equations and finding our compliments to 100! On Tuesday we had a really engaging talk with Mrs Smith from the Commonwealth War graves Commission who took us down to the cemetery in Dishforth and we discovered interesting facts about the war dead and the reasons for the Cemeteries around the UK and Mainland Europe! In PE Mr Sherwood gave us our first football lesson where we learned different dribbling techniques.

**Class 3** – Class 3 have had an exciting first week back. We have enjoyed our number fun workshop, learning maths through song and dance. The children are both currently learning about fractions in their maths lessons. In English, we have written diary entries about their holidays. We were excavators in history, asking questions about a discovery from the tomb of a well-known Egyptian scribe. Class 3 have also begun practising songs for Christmas on their clarinets.

At the end of the autumn term, we are saying good bye to Mrs Blyton after fifteen years of teaching at Dishforth CE Primary School. Afterwards, Elizabeth along with Class 2 and 3 walked to the war graves where Elizabeth had prepared an activity for them to participate in, then they returned back to the classroom where the children carried out a research activity on local casualties using an online database. Dave is a very experienced teacher and maths consultant who has written songs to accompany the teaching and learning of Maths throughout school from Nursery to Year 6. There are different songs to use for different purposes, such as: mental recall of facts, reasoning songs and songs which support the teaching of a mathematical concept. Dave has worked with White Rose Maths where his songs have been linked to different units of learning and last week gave us all the opportunity to see how this has been achieved when Dave delivered staff training at the end of the day.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
