# Newsletter 11 Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November 2023

I hope you all had a super weekend and enjoyed lovely autumn sunshine yesterday. It is a busy time in school as we seem to be whizzing through the term, therefore the newsletter today covers quite a bit of forthcoming events to help with planning for the festive season ahead.

#### Last week of clubs

Just a reminder that this week is the last week of clubs run by school staff. The multi-skills club which is run by Sporting Influence will continue until Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December. A new set of clubs will be on offer to the children after Christmas. Thank you to all the staff who have given up their time this term to run the clubs.

#### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** - This week in Early Years we have been looking at the book Owl Babies and have been learning lots of facts about owls. We have made a nest for baby owls using sticks, leaves and feathers. Children in reception have been writing simple sentences in speech bubbles. We have been learning about patterns in nursery and the numbers 4 and 5 in reception in our maths sessions. We are trying to recognise groups of objects without counting.

**Class 1** – Class 1 has had a fantastic week. The trip to the Herriot Museum was a fabulous morning with the children really enjoying learning about the changes since the 1950s. The children are having a great time writing about the Egg Box Dragon and his adventures. In maths the children are working hard to improve their addition and subtractions skills with Year 1 working on numbers within 10 and Year 2 working on numbers within 100. In DT the children have made a slider mechanism and in science they have been experimenting to find the different properties of materials.

**Class 2** - This week in Class 2 we have enjoyed looking at the causes and effects of flooding and drought. In Maths we are all looking at multiplication and division using arrays and sharing and in English we have looked at how authors use speech to help us understand character's thoughts and feelings. In RE this week we have looked at the story of Noah and how the Bible uses Rainbows as a sign of covenants between God and others. We also began our DT topic of creating a Roman money purse by first looking at different types of money holders and how they work.

**Class 3** – Class 3 have had an exciting and busy week. The children have begun writing persuasive letters in English. They have also used these skills to create a travel brochure about Europe in geography. In maths, they have learnt about equivalent fractions, mixed numbers and improper

fractions. We have "made a noise" for anti-bullying week in PSHCE and the children have created their own poem and looked at different scenarios. Y6 have also been learning more about how to keep safe, at crucial crew on Friday!

# Mrs Blyton

At the end of the autumn term, we are saying good bye to Mrs Blyton after fifteen years of teaching at Dishforth CE Primary School. Mrs Blyton has decided that it is time to end her contract here and spend more time with her family as well as having time to explore new opportunities. Mrs Blyton would like to thank the whole school community for making her time at Dishforth a very happy part of her career. Mrs Blyton will be greatly missed by us all.

We have appointed Mrs Laura McKelvey to lead science in the school from January.

#### James Herriot museum – transport funded by FODs

Class 1 had a super time on Thursday at the James Herriot Museum in Thirsk where they enhanced their learning about the life of Alf Wight and compared life in the 1940s / 50s to now. A huge thank you to Friends of Dishforth for subsidising the trip.

# Weekly Attendance

### Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
