Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all managed to have a lovely week last week, despite the weather! We have a very busy half term ahead of us with much to look forward to as we head towards the festive season – please keep checking diary dates.

This week our thoughts are very much about Remembrance and taking time to reflect. The children have worked on an installation to mark Remembrance – thank you to Mrs Cawood for organising this. Poppies are still on sale from the school office if you would like to donate to the Poppy Appeal.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week we have been learning about why we celebrate harvest and getting ready for our harvest festival. We have used wax crayons to make leaf rubbings, and have then cut these out to make Leaf man collages. In RE we had a visit from Rev Dianne, who came into our classroom to baptise one of our babies. We learned about what happens in a baptism service. We have enjoyed practising our harvest songs and poems.

Class 1 – Class 1 this week have been enjoying preparing for our harvest celebration. In maths we have been focusing on addition and subtraction, with year 2 crossing 10 and year 1 learning about fact families and number bonds to 10. In English lessons we have completed our own poem about birds flying and have really enjoyed watching videos of murmurations and pretending to be birds swooping and diving in the sky. In other lessons we have created our own compositions on glockenspiels and produced some poppy art work for remembrance.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have really enjoyed our computing project. We have been collecting information to use when we present a news bulletin using a green screen app. In Maths Year 4 have moved onto learning about area while year 3 are looking at increasingly tricky addition and subtraction questions. We have also been writing an alternative ending to our class text "The Miraculous journey of Edward Tulane" in our English lessons. We have been learning all about Harvest in preparation for our Harvest festival on Friday.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a fantastic end to the first half-term, celebrating the Harvest Festival! They have written poems for Harvest and finished their unit on newspaper report writing. The Y5 children have nearly finished their maths unit on multiplication and division, whilst the Y6 children have begun their unit on fractions. In computing, the children have finished their toys that have been programmed to make a noise using a micro bit. They have also thought of how God shows love, through the girt of creation and Jesus Christ. In art, they have finished their improved food packaging in our graphic design unit.

On Wednesday, we are welcoming Dave Godfrey to school who will be working with each class throughout the day delivering maths! Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
