# Newsletter 14 Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December 2023

Dear Parents / Carers,

Thank you to Friends of Dishforth for all their hard work in putting on the Christmas Fayre on Saturday and also thank you to everyone who supported the event.

We have a very busy week in school this week with much to look forward to – please read the newsletter carefully for events and timings.

Class 1 are performing their Nativity on Wednesday afternoon at 2pm and also on the evening at 5.30pm Please can I ask that the children in Class 1 arrive back at school at 5.15pm on Wednesday at the main entrance in order to get changed into their costumes for the performance – thank you.

On Friday afternoon the school are going to Baldersby St James Church for a Christingle Service. The Service begins at 1.45pm and families are welcome to join us. Children can be collected from the church – please let Mrs McBride know in the office. It is anticipated that the Service will last approximately 30 minutes.

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** - This week in EYFS we have been learning about 4 sided shapes and we have been naming and comparing different 4-sided shapes. In English we have been reading the book "Looking Up" and have learned lots of new vocabulary to do with space - including what a meteor is. In our art work we have been making space pictures using water colours and have used pipettes to drop paint to make stars and galaxies. I'm sure everyone will agree that the EYFS children did an amazing job in their nativity play and we are all very proud of them!

**Class 1** – It has been a busy week preparing for our Nativity and the children are busy perfecting their singing and dancing. In our English lessons we have begun looking at the book called "The day the Crayons Quit" and have begun thinking about our favourite colours of crayons and why we like them. In maths we are learning about shapes, naming the 2D and the 3D shapes and describing them using mathematical language. In our RE lesson we have been writing "Suzie sorry" prayers and "Peter praise" prayers whilst thinking about the things that we might be sorry for and the things we have to say thank you for.

**Class 2** - This week in Class 2 has been assessment week where we have had the opportunity to celebrate and show off all of our learning this term. We have also started the design process for our Roman Money purses that we are going to be making in Design Technology, In PE with Mr Sherwood we have been learning all about closing down space and making it hard for attackers to pass us with the football. In Computing we began to edit our green screen videos all about the Romans.

**Class 3** – Class 3 have been doing some assessments this week and they have put their greatest efforts into it! They have also begun their research about Charles Dickens ready to write a biography about him next week. They are finding his work extremely interesting and can't wait to see Oliver Twist at the theatre. The children have been analysing products that have been made with 3D printers and begun the process of making their own creations. We have decided on our format for our cookbook for computing and the children have designed and created some Christmas cards. They have also practised some songs ready for our Christingle service in church.

## Class 3 - Lily

We have had some exciting news in class 3! Lily Addison won a graphic design competition for our art last half term. She redesigned some oat cakes packaging from Nairns and as a result, has received a letter from the company and some products for herself and the class to try! Well done, Lily!

## Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
