Dear Parents / Carers,

I can't quite believe we are at the end of the autumn term and break-up on Friday. I hope your preparations are well under way for the festive season and on behalf of all the staff, we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas.

We have the Class 3 Oliver trip tomorrow, Christmas School Lunch to look forward to on Wednesday and the parties on Thursday – please read the newsletter carefully for further details.

We break up on Friday afternoon at an earlier time of 2.30pm and we will look forward to seeing the children on Tuesday 9th January when school opens for the spring term.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have been preparing for our Christingle service, learning about the different parts of the Christingles. We have been learning about day and night in maths, as well as recognising 4 sided shapes in the environment. We have been getting the classroom ready for Christmas and learning about Christmas traditions such as sending Christmas cards.

Class 1 – This week has been a very busy week in class 1. We have enjoyed performing the Nativity "It's a Baby" for you, I am sure that everyone will agree there were some fabulous singing, dancing and acting skills and that the children put on a stellar performance. In other lessons we have been learning all about Christingles and their symbolism, testing different papers to see which one will soak up the most water and writing about our favourite crayon colour-this is linked to our new book "The Day the Crayons Quit".

Class 2 - This week in class 2 we have had a very busy week. In DT we have absolutely loved designing and making our Roman Money purses. We have learnt different types of stitches and the children have worked very hard to construct and then embellish their purses. In maths we have continued our multiplication and division learning while in English we have written Newspaper articles based on our class text of the Iron Man. We have also enjoyed visiting church for our Christingle service.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a lovely but very busy week on the run up to Christmas! They have been preparing for the Christingle service, designing Christmas cards and doing their calendars. The children have also written their biography about Charles Dickens and completed their maths about finding fractions of an amount. In DT, the children have been programming the 3D printer to print their Christmas ornaments and they have also had their final swimming session on Thursday.

Swimming Class 2 - January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. Year 3 and Year 4 children start on Thursday 11th January. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions

or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming will be £5.00 each week. Payments are through your Parent Pay account. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Attendance

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
