Dear Parents / Carers,

We had a very productive first week back in school last week with new topics started.

It looks like we are in for quite a cold spell this week - I reminded the children on Friday to be finding and wearing their hats and gloves in preparation!

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have enjoyed talking about our experiences over Christmas. We have started our new topic based on Life in the Freezer. We have learned that Polar bears live in the Arctic and penguins live in the Antarctic. We were very excited to try and work out who had left a suitcase in our classroom one morning, and then a lost penguin arrived as well! We have asked questions to find out where the penguin has come from. In maths nursery have been learning all about number 3 and Reception have been subitising numbers from 0-5.

Class 1 – What a fantastic start to the new year! Class one have all returned well rested and eager to learn. We have begun with the story of the Jolly Postman and have already written predictions, made a story map and written a letter to Goldilocks. In maths year 2 are enjoying working with money and year 1 are learning how numbers are split into tens and ones. In our history lessons we have begun learning about the Great Fire of London and in our art lesson we learned about 2 new artists and practised making tones and shades of colours as well as experimenting with different brush strokes.

Class 2 - We have really enjoyed our first week back in Class 2. We have enjoyed reading our new class text of "The Wind in the Willows" by Kenneth Grahame which is also the play which we are performing this term. We enjoyed our first science lesson with Mrs McKelvey learning all about forces. In History we introduced our new topic on the Anglo Saxons by looking at how the Romans left Britain. In computing we have begun our topic on presenting information using Google slides.

Class 3 – Class 3 have begun their English unit looking at Darwin's Dragons by Lindsay Galvin. The children have read the first few chapters of the book and are using their prediction skills to finish the third chapter with their own ideas. We have begun our new maths unit looking at ratio, multiplication, and division. We have started our history and geography observing artefacts from the Mayans and biomes in a jar. In art the children have explored our new artist learning about drawing and identity.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
