Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas and happy start to the New Year. It is lovely to see the children back in school and hearing about their festivities.

Welcome

A very warm welcome to Mrs Laura McKelvey who has joined us today in Key Stage 2 as science lead and teacher.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have been learning about all things Christmas. We have written our Christmas cards and made some lovely butterfly calendars. In maths we have carried on our work on shape, making Christmas shape pictures. In RE we have thought about how the words for Away in a Manger link to different parts of the Christmas story.

Class 1 – Class 1 have had a fantastic week. Year 1 children have been learning about the numbers up to 20 and have enjoyed using tens and ones to describe the numbers. Year 2 have been focussing on shapes, naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes, finding lines of symmetry and making patterns. We have continued writing about the crayons and have read the story "The Crayons Christmas". In our geography lesson we compared Ripon to Dishforth and in RE we completed our work learning about what Christians believe God is like by exploring forgiveness and how forgiving others makes us feel.

Class 2 - This week in school has been very exciting in the run up to Christmas. We unfortunately said goodbye to Mrs Blyton on Wednesday and we will miss her science lessons. On Thursday we loved our Christmas party where we danced and played party games. In Geography we learned all about how fold mountains are formed and in History we created fact sheets about our favourite Roman Gods. Mr Sherwood organised a class 5 a side football tournament where we were able to showcase all of the skills he has taught us this term and we also really enjoyed making Christmas cards and calendars.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had an excellent week this week! We have been out on Tuesday afternoon to Leeds Playhouse theatre to watch Oliver Twist. The musical was brilliant and the children absolutely loved the experience. They were a credit to our school and set the best example. We have also finished our 3D designs and begun a competition for the children in DT to finish our unit of 3D printing. The children have thought of a design that a 3D printing engineer would do to benefit others. The winners are yet to be announced, but Mrs Chester and her son Mark have kindly donated some Tinker cad merchandise for the winners and runners up. We have had a lovely Christmas dinner and leavers ceremony on Wednesday for Mrs Blyton. On Thursday, we had our Christmas party, which the children thoroughly enjoyed!

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
