Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all had a super half term. We have much to look forward to over the coming weeks as we head towards Easter.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have been learning about Chinese dragons. We have learned the story of Nian the dragon, and how this relates to Chinese New Year celebrations. In maths we have been learning about odd and even numbers and doubling.

Class 1 – Class 1 have really enjoyed writing some figurative poetry about the Great Fire of London this week. They have learned about rhyming poems, metaphors and personification and tried to use these to write their own poems. Year 2 are rising to the challenge of using their times tables to share, double and half numbers and Year 1 have been working hard to find the different, subtract and find missing numbers in addition and subtraction problems. In Geography we have learned the 4 countries of the UK and located some different coastal towns, we have also planned a route around St Ives giving directions using geographical vocabulary of north, south, east and west. In science we are continuing to learn about animals and humans, we learned about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores as well as that animals need food, air and water to survive. It has been another busy week packed with learning!

Class 2 - This week in class 2 we have loved having Sam, the dance coach, in. She has begun putting dances to our songs for the school production and we really enjoyed learning them. In Science we made compasses using a bowl of water, needles and magnets. In Maths Year 4 have begun learning about fractions greater than 1 and Year 3 and been calculating perimeter. On Thursday we enjoyed our weekly swimming trip and in PHSE we have talked about children's mental health week and staying safe on the internet.

Class 3 – Class 3 have had a great end to this half-term. They have been looking at multiplying/ dividing fractions (Y5) and algebra (Y6). In English, they have been planning, drafting and writing a debate about "Who was more significant the Maya or the Egyptians?". The children have also been learning about the hierarchy of society in the Mayan times. They have created a leaflet as a tour guide to tell people what to expect when

they visit a Mayan city. In clarinet, they have been writing their own music and having a go at performing it to each other. We have also finished our art project about identity.

Scholastic Book Fair

On **Thursday 29**th **February, Friday 1**st **March and Monday 4**th **March** we will be holding a Scholastic Book Fair in the hall at 3.15pm each day. The fair will be selling a range of books suitable from Early Years to Year 6. More information can be found on the attached leaflet. Forest Schools - starting TODAY for Class 3

Miss Rachel Hunt is back at Dishforth CE Primary School as our Forest School teacher.

Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year.

Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2023 - 24 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots; waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Class 3 will have Forest Schools today, 26th February and the 4th March in the afternoon. Please bring the outdoor clothing and footwear above in a named bag.

<u>Swimming Class 2 – Thursday</u>



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 3 and Year 4 children go on Thursday**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a

cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming will be £5.00 each week. Payments are through your Parent Pay account. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
