Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in EYFS we have been learning about how to keep our teeth healthy. We have talked about food and drink that is good for our teeth. In maths Reception have continued our work on 9 and 10, learning about 1 more. Nursery have been learning about height. In RE we have started to learn the Easter story, thinking about why a donkey and palm leaves were important on Palm Sunday.

Class 1 – We have had another fun packed week in Class 1 with lots of learning. We are all learning about mass, capacity and temperature in maths and have been enjoying using balances. In writing we have been honing our sentence skills and focussing on extending our sentences using the connective and. In our DT lessons we have begun building the furniture for our rooms, putting into practise the joining skills learned previously.

Class 2 - This week in Class 2 our preparation for the production has really ramped up! We have rehearsed our dances with Sam and introduced the beautiful props made by Mrs Chester, we are looking forward to performing for you all next week. In science this week we have been celebrating British Science Week. In our lesson we investigated vibrations with a range of different musical activities and on Friday we had a really fun afternoon with Professor Bubbleworks. In Maths Year 4 have begun to look at decimals and dividing single digit numbers by ten and year 3 have been looking at mass and capacity. In Geography we looked at the impact of the eruption of mt. Vesuvius in Pompeii.

Class 3 – Class 3 have been writing their biographies about Charles Darwin, using their knowledge of relative clauses (with and without relative pronouns), pronouns and cohesive devices. They have also been focussing on multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000, and have been learning how to multiply decimals by integers. We have also started looking at mean, median, mode and range too. The children have started their final projects in computing, filming to advertise our play for the summer term. In rugby, we have been working on attacking and defending, whilst working together to keep a strong line of defence. In music, we learnt how to play hot cross buns for their Easter music finale.

<u>Year 5 Enrichment Day – Thirsk High School</u>

Tomorrow Year 5 have been invited to experience a day at secondary school at Thirsk. Children will need to be a school for 8.30am, ready to leave on the buses at 8.40am. They will return to school for home time. Children are to come in their PE kits and they will need a packed lunch, water bottle and a warm coat.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
