

Dear Parents / Carers,

We have a lovely week to look forward to in school this week with World Book Day on Thursday along with our promotional school dinner and vegetable book character competition! A huge thank you as well to everyone who has supported the book fair – last day today!

As you know, I am leaving Dishforth CE Primary School at the end of this term and a new headteacher has been appointed, Mrs Lacey. I am pleased to let you know that Mrs Lacey will be visiting school on Thursday morning where we will carry out meet and greet together and then we will be with the children for Collective Worship.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS - This week in Early Years we have been continuing to learn about the story of The Three Little Pigs. We have looked at the different materials used to build houses. We have been learning about tall and short in maths and have been comparing the height of different objects and towers that we have built. In literacy we have been finding more interesting words to use instead of happy and sad, and have been writing sentences using these words.

Class 1 – It has been a great week in Class 1. We have been thinking about the signs of spring and have written a poem, taking care to write in sentences. In maths Year 2 have begun learning about measuring using cm, mm and m and Year 1 have been practising their partitioning skills with numbers up to 50. In geography we have used maps to name the countries of the UK, the surrounding seas and the different islands around the UK. In science we learned about our senses and matched each sense with a different body part.

Class 2 - In Class 2 this week we have really enjoyed writing our explanation texts on how bees make honey. We have looked through the process of how bees collect nectar and then produce the honey before storing it. In Science, we completed our unit on Forces and magnets. Mrs McKelvey was really impressed with how everyone performed in our quiz. We took to the stage in our rehearsals for our play for the first time this week which was a big step in getting ready for our performance in a few weeks' time and we all enjoyed our trip to the swimming pool on Thursday.

Class 3 – In maths this week we have been looking at some arithmetic questions relating to percentages and fractions. We have also been recapping some of the algebra in Y6 as well as

learning about decimals. In English we have started to learn more about cohesion using relative clauses with and without the relative pronouns. We have looked at when it is appropriate to use passive voice rather than active voice and we have played games relating to the editing process. The children have been testing different materials and their properties in science. They have also investigated which substances dissolved in water. We have been designing our bird hides in DT this week, thinking carefully about the features they will need.

Scholastic Book Fair – last day today!

Today is the last day we will be holding the Scholastic Book Fair in the hall at 3.15pm. The fair will be selling a range of books suitable from Early Years to Year 6. More information can be found on the attached leaflet. Payment for books can be made on the day, either by cash, or through a QR code online payment link that will be available in the school hall.

<u>Attendance</u>

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
