# Newsletter 26 Tuesday 9th April 2024

As well as a new Headteacher we are delighted to welcome some new children to the school. A big welcome to Jack in Year 4 and our Nursery new starters

### Class News:

**EYFS** - This week in Early Years we have been learning the Easter story and Easter traditions. We have learnt about why hot cross buns have a cross on them and have decorated crosses with paper flowers to show new life. We have made an Easter Garden using resources we have found in our outdoor area, to help us understand more about the Easter story, on Good Friday and Easter Sunday. In PE we have been moving to a beat in different ways.

**Class 1** – It has been another busy week in Class 1 with poetry writing, card making and lots of maths learning. We have been looking at capacity and volume this week, comparing the capacities of objects and learning how to measure volume. Year 2 have learned how to measure in millilitres and litres and they have also learned how to read different temperature scales. We have evaluated the rooms with furniture that the children so enjoyed making and have now completed our learning about the Jewish faith.

Class 2 - In Class 2 this week we have loved finally being able to perform for you all. We have loved this term, spending time really understanding the story and putting on our performance of The Wind in the Willows by Kenneth Grahame. Thank you all who provided costumes and helped with lines! In Geography this week we retold the events of Pompeii in 79AD and in Maths we have continued our learning all about Weights and Measures in year 3, and decimals in year 4. In Science with Mrs McKelvey, we made our own musical instruments, mini guitars and pan pipes, looking at how the length of strings and pipes changes the pitch of the instrument.

Class 3 – Class 3 have been busy this week practising for the Easter service in church. We have also been learning how to use dialogue to advance action in writing, when writing narratives. We have been learning about decimals, fractions and percentages in maths. The children have been working hard to finish their computing advertisements on I-movie. They have also been creating documentaries about 'What it is like to be a Muslim in Britain'. We have also created our bird hides in DT and will be evaluating these in the beginning of summer term.

## Year 5 Enrichment Day – Thirsk High School

On Tuesday Year 5 enjoyed a full day of activities at Thirsk School. They made shortbread biscuits (they were delicious!), took part in a football training session run by York City FC, using some red cabbage they learnt about acids, alkaline and neutrals in science and finally they took a trip back in time to learn about la révolution française and discovered that some French words were very similar to those in the English language. A great day was had by all.

## Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
