It was wonderful to see the children's work and hear them speak so well about their learning and it was clear to me that parents and carers might like the chance to share this too.

What have we been learning this week?	
EYFS	Class 1
This week in Early Years we have started our new topic on growing. We were interested to find out whether seeds need soil to grow so we have planted bean seeds in soil and in plastic bags. In maths Reception have been finding different ways of making 10. In RE we have started our new topic on Special Places, thinking about where our own special place is. We all enjoyed the Boxercise session trying out different types of exercise!	We have had a fabulous start to the new term in Class 1. We have begun our new topic of seaside's and have kicked off with the story of The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch. We have been getting to know the story this week. In history we have begun learning about Grace Darling,, who also lived in a lighthouse like the main character in a Lighthouse Keepers Lunch, making predictions about why she might be famous and we are excited to find out what she did! In art we have begun our "stick transformation project" by using found items to create a plant. This has linked really well to our science this term which is all about plants and already the children have named different plants, parts of a plant and begun learning about the different types of plants that we eat-fruit, vegetables and herbs.
Class 2	Class 3
Welcome back to Class 2. I hope you all had a brilliant Easter holiday. This week in Class 2 we loved having Dave from Skip2bFit in school on Thursday. He put us through our paces with a workout which included elements of skipping and boxing fitness. In science we have been learning about the ear, having lots of fun acting out what each part of the ear does. In English we have written news articles and in Geography we located different cities in the UK using compass directions.	Class 3 have had a fantastic first week back at school. We have been doing some creative writing in English consolidating our learning on using dialogue to advance the action in a narrative. In maths, we have been learning about finding fractions, percentages and decimals. The children have had the opportunity to complete a Skip2beFit / boxercise workshop, where we looked at growth mindset and progress. We have started our new unit of work in history about the ancient Greeks and their influence on the western world. In geography, we have begun learning about our local area and we have thought about what we want to know before the end of the unit.


