

We hope you enjoyed finding out what everyone had been up to and celebrating our achievements with us. We're very much looking forward to seeing parents/carers of Classes 1 and 3 on Friday 26th April. At 2.45 the green gate on the KS2 side of the school will be open to allow you to come and sit at the back of the hall. Please do not come through the main entrance. The children will return to class at the end (3.10pm) and can be collected as usual. We look forward to inviting parents of EYFS and Class 2 next Friday 3rd May.

Lastly, we have had an email from a local farmer who is concerned about our children's safety. He is worried about children playing unsupervised on fields around the village. There is risk from large moving machinery but also from exposure to the chemicals that have been sprayed on some of the crops. He is also concerned about children accessing private land without permission. I will speak to all the children about this in school but I wanted to make you aware of his concerns so that you can have a conversation about this at home, if you feel that it's appropriate.

What have we been learning this week? **EYFS** Class 1 This week in EYFS we have continued our Class 1 have been really enjoying the provision areas in learning on growing. This week in class 2 we have had a fantastic week. In Science with Mrs McKelvey we investigated different materials to see which ones would make the best ear defenders. In English we have read our new class text - The Abominables by Eva Ibbotson - and looked in depth at some of the main characters. In History this week we created a timeline of the Anglo Saxon and Viking struggle for Britain, right up to the battle of Hastings in 1066. We were really excited this week to go to The Theatre Royal in Newcastle to see the stage production of The Wizard of Oz. We all absolutely loved the production and seeing the play performed with a full orchestra was really special.

Class 3 have had a busy but fantastic week! In science, they have been setting up their own experiments with mentos and coca cola. The children have also been learning about French culture, signing the tricolour song and learning about significant places, rivers, mountain ranges and the countries that France borders. Class 3 have created a timeline of significant events in ancient Greece and then learnt about some famous Greek people that influenced our lives today. We have also constructed two towers (made of Lego and straws) to represent the parable of the wise and the foolish builders. We learnt about how Christians believe listening to Jesus will give us strong foundations for our lives.
