Headteacher's Message

Last week was Safeguarding Week in school. The children learnt lots of different ways that they can keep themselves safe, including taking part in an assembly about the importance of wearing seatbelts when they are travelling in a car, even if only for a very short distance. Our reception children have a had a fantastic time completing their second session learning how to use a balance bike. Their skills have been very impressive and it has been lovely to see them grow in confidence and for some of them to shine and show their balance skills in a different context to their usual PE lesson. Perhaps we have a future Laura or Jason Kenny in our midst?

This week we are very excited that class 3 will be performing their production of Oliver on Wednesday at 2pm and then again at 6pm. They have worked very hard and can't wait to show it to you all. They will be performing a selection of songs for the younger children in school, so that everyone can see their amazing talent in action. I also have to inform you that as of September we will be raising the cost of our schools meals from the current £3.13 per meal to £3.28. A rise of 15p. This is entirely due to a price rise from our school meal provider NYES Catering Service, who have seen a huge increase in staffing costs and the price of food. We do not make a profit on meals. The price charged to school for each meal matches the price we charge to you. The governors and I do not take the decision to ask parents for this lightly, everyone understands that the cost of living has increased greatly in recent times and that times are tough for lots of families. If you are concerned about your circumstances or would like support around this issue, please do not hesitate to get in touch. Free school meals for KS1 children will continue as usual.

What have we been learning this week?

EYFS

This week in Early Years we have been learning about how to keep ourselves safe. We have learnt about how to be safe when we are close to water, and the importance of learning how to float on our backs. We have talked about how to phone for the fire brigade and the importance of knowing our own address. When we talked about keeping safe around dogs we learned a song to remind us how to approach a dog if we want to pat them.

Class 1

It has been a great week in Class 1. All of the children have worked hard to show everything that they have learned during the assessments and had lots of fun along the way. We have enjoyed learning how to keep safe when we are near dogs, near water, on line and if we see a fire. The children made some fabulous posters and really enjoyed explaining to each other how to keep safe.

Class 2

In Class 2 this week, we have been doing assessments. The children have worked incredibly hard and we are very proud of the effort they have put into all of their tests. This week, we have also been completing activities for our 'Safeguarding Week'. We have learnt about water safety, fire safety and dog safety and designed informative posters to demonstrate our learning. In science, we had a very exciting time exploring the different kinds of seed dispersal. The children were very enthusiastic to look around the school grounds to find more examples. They have also been keen to check on the growth of their plants. In DT, the children have started their new topic on Levers and Linkages

Class 3

Class 3 have had a nice week this week. They have been writing a formal email using persuasive techniques. They have also been looking at their new unit of work in maths focussing on multiplying decimals and problem solving. The children have been conducting their own experiments in science. In music they have finished a fantastic (but very fast) piece of music, well done children! We have also looked at safeguarding and how to keep safe at school in PSHCE.
